


## Athens Police Department Training at Athens City Middle School

The TWU Pledge allows HOPE Scholarship eligible first year students with a family adjusted gross income of \$50,000 or less to attend Tennessee Wesleyan University tuition free.

Tennessee Wesleyan consistently ranks high among many college and university ranking agencies, often with a cost of attendance well below other regional private and public universities. The TWU Pledge, for those meeting the criteria, will make Tennessee Wesleyan an even better option as students consider their postsecondary education objectives.
