State of Tennessee Investigation

The state of Tennessee is now investigating a 'series of improper and questionable activities' at the sheriff's department in Rhea County. Those activities included improper inmate releases, employees getting paid for time not worked, giving a non-certified animal shelter administrator a weapon, and making questionable expenses for a Christmas toy drive, including alcohol. Key findings revealed that the sheriff and jail staff released inmates without court officer approval. The report says two department employees were found to have performed work for the sheriff and his son while still on the department's payroll. The report says three employees misappropriated at least \$20,678.58 by receiving compensation for time not worked. Also, the sheriff authorized the animal shelter administrator to carry out 'questionable duties' and provided her with a weapon, despite her lack of P.O.S.T. (Peace Officer Standing and Training Commission) certification. The investigation also highlighted questionable expenditures totaling at least \$12,124.22 by the Rhea County Angel Tree Toy Drive, operated by the sheriff's department. From: newschannel9.com
