Man Charged with Threatening Sweetwater Hospital



A man has been charged for making threats of mass violence against Sweetwater Hospital last Thursday, according to authorities.

Officers responded to the hospital follow-

ing a phone call in which a bomb threat was made, along with threats to shoot individuals at the facility.

The suspect, Vernon Knode, was apprehended by the Chattanooga Police Department after officers and detectives traced his location, according to a spokesperson for Sweetwater Police.

"We want to reassure our community that the safety of our citizens is our top priority, and threats of this nature are taken extremely seriously," said Sweetwater Police Sergeant Kelvin Franco. "We would like to extend our gratitude to the Sweetwater Hospital Association, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, and Chattanooga Police Department for their assistance in resolving this situation peacefully."

Tennessee defeats Florida in Overtime, Offensive Struggles Persist



Tennessee held off Florida with a 23-17 overtime victory at Neyland Stadium on Saturday, keeping their College Football Playoff hopes alive despite continued offensive struggles. The Vols took an early lead with their fast-paced attack, but inconsistent play slowed them down. Tennessee managed just 312 yards of offense against a Florida defense that ranks near the bottom of the SEC, allowing an average of 395 yards per game.

Tennessee's struggles on the offensive line, which have plagued them in recent games, limited the effectiveness of quarterback Nico Iamaleava, who turned the ball over on a botched exchange and threw a costly interception.

Iamaleava, a redshirt freshman, has faced criticism for his ball-handling issues and appeared uncertain throughout the game, completing just 16 of 26 passes for 169 yards. While he continues to struggle with turnovers and accuracy, running back Dylan Sampson proved a bright spot, rushing for 112 yards and three touchdowns.

Penalties from the offensive line and missed opportunities, such as Iamaleava's overthrows to open receivers, hindered the Vols' ability to put the game away in regulation. Despite these setbacks, Tennessee's defense stepped up, holding Florida to 361 yards and forcing a crucial turnover near the goal line. The Vols scored the tiebreaking touchdown on a one-yard rush to secure the victory.

With Alabama next on the schedule, Tennessee's playoff chances remain in question. The Vols' offense will need to improve quickly, particularly Iamaleava's performance, if they hope to remain in contention for a championship.
