Gov. Lee Announces New Funding for Nuclear Education



Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee and Department of Economic and Community Development (TNECD) Commissioner Stuart C. McWhorter recently announced that Tennessee Tech University (Tech) will receive funding from Tennessee's Nuclear Energy Fund. The institution will use the additional dollars to support existing nuclear programs as well as develop and implement new nuclear education curriculum. In response to growing workforce needs of nuclear companies in Tennessee, Tech established a nuclear engineering program, designed to bolster student recruitment and complement existing nuclear engineering programs across the state.

The curriculum will include principles of nuclear energy production, reactor systems design, spent fuel reprocessing, nuclear safety and nuclear cybersecurity. The enhanced program at the Cookeville campus will play a vital role in attracting nuclear companies to the region. The \$50 million Nuclear Energy Fund was in Gov. Lee's recommended 2023-2024 budget and approved by the Tennessee General Assembly. An additional \$10 million was allocated and approved in the state's budget during the 2024 legislative session.

The fund assists nuclear power-related businesses choosing to relocate or grow in the Volunteer State and supports the state's universities and research institutions in further developing their nuclear education programs.

The project announced on Tuesday, October 15 was supported by the Tennessee Nuclear Energy Council's Education and Workforce committee, part of the 22-member Tennessee Nuclear Energy Advisory Council.

Athens Leaf Vacuum Season Starts Soon



The City of Athens Public Works Department has announced the start of Leaf Vacuum Season, beginning Monday, November 4, 2024, at 7:00 a.m. Residents are reminded to rake their leaves three to five feet from the road but to avoid placing them in the street, drainage ditches, or on sidewalks, as this poses hazards and may cause

flooding by clogging storm drains. Leaves should be placed behind sidewalks in areas where they exist, and not around obstacles like mailboxes, fences, or vehicles, as these piles won't be collected. Leaves should also not be placed on utility covers to prevent damage to equipment. The city will not respond to individual pick-up requests, and collection crews will work through designated zones, completing all zones before starting the process again. Vols Face Alabama in Must-Win Scenario



This weekend's matchup between Alabama and Tennessee is crucial, with both teams struggling but still aiming for a College Football Playoff spot. Alabama narrowly survived a win against South Carolina after a tough loss to Vanderbilt. With road games at LSU and Oklahoma looming, plus Missouri and Auburn at home, the Crimson Tide face a challenging path. Tennessee, coming

off a win over Florida and a loss to Arkansas, has an easier schedule but needs this victory to stay in the hunt.

Alabama's offense, led by standout quarterback Jalen Milroe—who's in the Heisman conversation—remains explosive, averaging over 11 yards per throw with 12 touchdown passes and 11 rushing touchdowns. However, their defense has faltered, struggling to get off the field on key third downs, especially in the loss and tight games.

Tennessee's defense, one of the best in the country on third-down stops, has kept every opponent under 20 points, but their secondary has shown vulnerabilities. Despite Alabama's recent inconsistencies, their ability to "bomb away" might be too much for the Vols, setting up an exciting, high-scoring contest. Both teams need this win to stay in playoff contention, making it a must-watch SEC showdown. This game seems unpredictable for even many experts. In a statement exclusive to the Morning Fax, VFL and former NFL wide-receiver Jayson Swain stated: "Somebody's gonna score.. Somebody's gonna win.. I'm thinking 31-27... This is the first game where I can't figure out the winner.."
