#### **More Athens City Council Recap**

The Athens City Council recently approved a motion for minimum and maximum amounts to be allowed per entity for tourism funds request applications. The minimum will be \$500 and the maximum was increased from \$10,000 to \$15,000. Also a motion was passed to review submitted applications for tourism funds no later than the July 1st deadline.

Another motion was passed to allocate funds for Fiscal Year 2025 from the Hotel / Motel tax. The Athens Area Council for the Arts will receive the maximum of \$15,000. Friendly City Festivals was granted the maximum of \$15,000. Main Street Athens was granted \$8,200 and the McMinn County Living Heritage Museum was granted \$10,000.

A motion was approved to reallocate funds between Main Street Athens and the LITE HOUSE from the General Fund. \$35,000 will go to Main Street and \$15,000 will go to the LITE HOUSE.

A motion was tabled to an annexation of property request located on County Road 126 aka Milton Road, by George Andrew Hodges. The tract is being considered for a subdivision for 141 new homes. More engineering work will have to be done before the city will reconsider annexation.





# Phone Appointments Available for Medicare Part D Open Enrollment

While all in-person slots are booked, the McMinn Senior Activity Center is offering phone appointments for individuals needing assistance with Medicare Part D during the open enrollment period. Trained, non-biased counselors will be available to help those who want to enroll, make changes, or leave their current plan. Phone appointments are available on October 31, November 21, and December 5.

Medicare Open Enrollment runs from October 15 through December 7, with changes taking effect on January 1, 2025. This period is for individuals aged 65 and over who are already enrolled in Medicare, allowing them to adjust their coverage for the coming year.

Appointments are free, and no membership is required to access this service. To book an appointment, call the McMinn Senior Activity Center at 423-745-6830. Before your appointment, stop by the Center to pick up a 2024 Medicare Part D Plan Comparison Worksheet or print one from <a href="https://www.mcminnseniors.com">www.mcminnseniors.com</a>. Completed worksheets must be returned to the Center before your scheduled appointment.
