Garage Fire Destroys Property in Athens



A fire early Sunday morning resulted in the total loss of a garage and its contents on County Road 600. Relatives of the homeowner, who were staying in a camper on the property, reported hearing an explosion around 1:30 a.m.

Upon investigating, they discovered the garage engulfed in flames and attempted to extinguish the fire using a garden hose.

Despite their efforts, the garage and its contents were destroyed, including a John Deere tractor, a Gator, a motorcycle, a Honda fourwheeler, and various tools. Multiple fire departments responded to the blaze, including Athens Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, and Claxton Fire. Additional support was provided by AMR, the McMinn County Sheriff's Department, and Athens Utilities Board (AUB). Englewood Rural Fire Lt. Caleb Martin led the response. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Resident Burned in Bonfire in Englewood



A bonfire accident late Friday night resulted in a resident being airlifted to a specialized burn center. Around 10:30 p.m., the homeowner on County Road 461 attempted to ignite a


bonfire using gasoline, which caused the flames to ignite his clothing.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrived to find the fire extinguished by a water hose. Due to the severity of the injuries, AMR requested a medical helicopter, which transported the patient from Starr Regional Medical Center in Etowah to Wellstar Cobb Medical Burn Center in Austell, Georgia.

Responding agencies included Etowah Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department.
