
Cherokee Beekeepers Association Meeting



Tennessee Bound for the College Football Playoffs, Heupel Makes History



With a 36-23 victory over Vanderbilt, the No. 8 Tennessee Volunteers (10-2, 6-2 SEC) have secured a spot in the newly expanded 12-team College Football Playoffs. While Selection Sunday on Dec. 8 will finalize matchups, Tennessee's position in the rankings confirms their postseason berth.

"Next step for us as a program," said head coach Josh Heupel. "It was a goal, but there was an expectation to be in this. Proud of these guys for executing and putting us in a position to be there. Now the next season starts, what are we gonna do with it?"

The Vols overcame a rocky start against Vanderbilt, falling behind 14-0

early, but rallied with determination to finish strong. Reflecting on the win, Heupel highlighted his team's resilience. "Best league in America," he said of the SEC. "This is a special group to handle the ups and downs, to keep competing to push forward."

The win marks the second 10-win season during Heupel's tenure, putting him alongside Tennessee legends Phillip Fulmer and Robert Neyland as the only coaches to achieve multiple double-digit regular seasons.

Players shared the excitement of reaching this milestone but emphasized their focus on what lies ahead. "Great feeling, man," said quarterback Nico Iamaleava. "Now the real work starts. It's go time for us."

Running back Jaylen Wright reflected on the significance of the accomplishment. "You don't really realize it until you stop and think about it. We've got something special ahead of us," he said.

Tennessee's next challenge will come in late December, as they prepare to face a yet-to-be-determined opponent. Linebacker Arion Carter summed up the team's mindset: "All we ever wanted really was a chance. And we were able to get that. We've got to seize the opportunity."

For Tennessee, the road to glory starts now.
