### Starr Regional Debuts Advanced PAD Treatment

Starr Regional Medical Center has become one of the first facilities in East Tennessee to perform a groundbreaking treatment for severe peripheral arterial disease (PAD), offering new hope to patients with calcified arteries.

The innovative procedure applies lithotripsy technology, traditionally used to treat kidney stones, to address problematic arterial lesions above and below the knee, including critical limb-threatening ischemia (CLTI).

"The cardiovascular team at Starr Regional Medical Center is dedicated to providing patients access to the latest advancements in treating peripheral artery disease," said Dr. Yasir Akhtar, interventional cardiologist. "We are thrilled to offer new treatment options and improve outcomes... right here in McMinn County."

Starr Regional's cardiac catheterization lab, launched in 2023, is part of the hospital's comprehensive cardiovascular program, which includes diagnostic, interventional, and rehabilitative care for heart and vascular conditions. The hospital is also an accredited Chest Pain Center.

CEO John McLain emphasized the hospital's commitment to advancing care locally. "By enhancing our cardiovascular services, we... ensure the entire region we serve has greater access to life-saving care," McLain

PAD affects over 8 million Americans over age 40, increasing their risk of heart attack or stroke, according to the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute.


#### **Community News You Can Use**

## House Fire in Philadelphia Under Investigation



The Loudon County Sheriff's Office said a house fire in Philadelphia is under investigation. According to Cody Bengel with LCSO, a fire broke out at an abandoned home on Spring Street at around 10:30 p.m. on Thursday. Bengel said the fire started in the garage and spread to the inside of the home. Additionally, Bengel said it is being investigated as a case of reckless burning inside the home. Bengel added that investigators have a "decent description of the suspect" but have yet to identify one. No injuries were reported in the fire, Bengel said. Responding agencies include Loudon County Fire and Rescue, Greenback and Philadelphia fire departments and LCSO.

### Tennessee Men's Basketball Climbs to No. 3 in the Nation



The University of Tennessee men's basketball team (7-0) surged to third place in the Associated Press Top 25 and USA TODAY Coaches Poll, marking another milestone under head coach Rick Barnes. This ascent continues Tennessee's streak of excellence, as the Volunteers have been ranked in the AP Poll for 64 consecutive weeks—third-longest in the nation behind Houston and Kansas.


Tennessee's dominance this season is evident. The team has led for over 95% of game time

across seven contests, with no deficit exceeding three points. Their most recent victory, a 78-35 win over UT Martin, set program records for defensive performance.

The Volunteers boast 60 AP top-10 rankings during Barnes' tenure, including 28 in the top five—a program benchmark. They are joined in the top 25 by seven other SEC teams, with Auburn ranked second and Kentucky in the top six. Tennessee also leads the nation in the NCAA's first NET rankings of the season and is ranked second in KenPom. The team looks to extend its winning streak on Tuesday night, hosting Syracuse in the SEC/ACC Challenge at Food City Center. **Source: Tennessee Athletics**
