Stellantis Recalls Over 300K RAM Trucks over **Faulty Brake Component**



Stellantis is recalling over 317,000 STELLANTIS Ram Heavy Duty trucks from the 2017 -18 model years due to a faulty hydraulic control unit that could cause anti-

lock brake, electronic stability control, and traction control systems to malfunction. Regular braking systems remain unaffected, and the company has reported no injuries related to the issue.

The recall affects Ram 2500, 3500, 4500, and 5500 models, including a small number in Canada, Mexico, and other markets. Stellantis will notify affected customers and provide repairs free of charge. For more information, customers can contact 1-800-853-1403.

This follows recent Stellantis recalls of Jeep and Dodge SUVs as well as earlier recalls of nearly 1.5 million Ram pickups for software issues. Amid declining sales, layoffs, and rising inventory, Stellantis has also announced leadership changes, with CEO Carlos Tavares stepping down last week. Stellantis was formed in 2021 through the merger of PSA Peugeot and Fiat Chrysler Automobiles. Source: WBIR

Monroe County Sheriff Issues Statement

The Monroe County Sheriff's Office conducted an investigation into criminal allegations of two deputies that were employed with the Sheriff's Office in 2022. During the course of the investigation, after reviewing the facts, I requested the Tenth Judicial District Attorney's Office to continue the investigation with the assistance of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. The two deputies resigned from their positions during the ongoing investigation. The facts and evidence was presented to the Monroe County Grand Jury on December 4, 2024 and indictments were returned on both former deputies. Both former deputies were booked into the Monroe County Jail on December 4, 2024.

As your Sheriff of Monroe County, I have promised to uphold my deputies to a higher standard. No one that wears a badge is above the law, and if a law enforcement officer breaks the public's trust by committing a crime, and violating their oath while wearing a badge, then they need to be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. When I took the office as Sheriff, I promised transparency

and will continue to be transparent throughout my service as your

2023 Cleveland Shooting Suspect Arrested in AZ

A Cleveland man who was wanted in a shooting in 2023 has been arrested in Arizona. In March of 2023, the Cleveland Police Criminal Investigations Division responded to the Classy Cat on Inman Street on a call of a shooting. Cleveland Police Department officers encountered two women who had been shot.

The investigations division identified the suspect as Brandon Crofton. Crofton fled the state and could not be located. Warrants were issued on Crofton for attempted first-degree murder (2), possession of firearm during a felony, reckless endangerment with serious injury / use of a deadly weapon. The Cleveland Police Department requested assistance from the U.S. Marshals Service. The agencies worked together, exhausting a tremendous amount of man hours, conducting interviews, and utilizing various investigative techniques to obtain a reliable source, which ultimately led law enforcement to Glendale, Az.

During a surveillance operation, the U.S. Marshals Service in Arizona observed Crofton in a vehicle and apprehended him, without incident, at a local business. Crofton is now awaiting extradition back to Tennessee. Source: Chattanoogan.com

Man Severely Burned in Benton House Fire

The injured man was transported by AmeriPro EMS to a LifeForce landing zone and flown to the Wellstar Cobb Medical Center burn unit in Austell, Georgia, for treatment. Responding agencies included West Polk Fire Department, Englewood Rural Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, Polk County Sheriff's Department, and VEC. West Polk Fire Chief Keith Jeskee led the response.

Tennessee Football Secures No. 9 Seed in Playoffs, First-Round Road Game in Colombus



The College Football Playoff (CFP) enters a new era with the unveiling of its first 12-team bracket, marking a historic shift from the four-team format. Among the surprises, SMU earned a spot at No. 11 over perennial powerhouse Alabama, following the Mustangs' narrow ACC Championship loss to Clemson. This decision leaves Alabama out of the playoff for the first time in the CFP era, ensuring no three-loss teams except for Clemson make the cut.

The top four seeds—Georgia, Michigan, Boise State, and Arizona State—received first-round byes. Boise State and Arizona State represent notable Group of Five programs earning high seeds in a field otherwise dominated by traditional powerhouses.

First-Round Matchups

The first round kicks off on Dec. 20, featuring the following matchups:

- No. 10 Indiana v. No. 7 Notre Dame (12/20, 8pm, ABC)
- No. 11 SMU v. No. 6 Penn State (12/21, noon, TNT)
- No. 5 Texas vs. No. 12 Clemson (12/21, 4pm, TNT)
- No. 9 Tennessee v. No. 8 Ohio State (12/21, 8pm, ABC) Winners will advance to the quarterfinals, where they will face one of the top four seeds.

Key Storylines

- SMU's Improbable Journey: SMU's selection over Alabama reflects a commitment to rewarding teams with strong seasons, despite setbacks like their ACC Championship loss.
- Alabama's Exclusion: The Crimson Tide's absence marks a dramatic change, leaving just three SEC teams in the playoff field. Alabama's exclusion was a disappointment for first-year head coach Kalen DeBoer, who faced a challenging transition season in Tuscaloosa.
- **Group of Five Representation:** In addition to SMU, Boise State's No. 3 seed highlights the growing competitiveness of non-Power Five programs. Army, UNLV, and Memphis also appeared in the final Top 25 rankings.

Expanded Playoff Impact

This expanded format introduces 11 games, significantly increasing the number of high-stakes matchups. Previously, the CFP featured just two semifinal games and a championship. The new structure ensures more opportunities for teams to compete for a national title and enhances excitement for fans.

The first round begins Dec. 20, with matchups airing across major networks. Tennessee vs. Ohio State headlines the schedule on Dec. 21, setting the tone for the playoffs' inaugural 12-team season. Fans and programs alike are eagerly anticipating this new chapter in college football history.
