About a quarter of the railway's tracks and its cable system were destroyed, and CARTA, its opearator, awaits assessments to plan repairs. The Incline Railway, which generates \$2.8


million annually, is a major revenue source for CARTA and a draw for local businesses in St. Elmo. Nearby shops were evacuated, raising concerns about financial impacts from reduced tourism and closures. The timeline for repairs and reopening remains uncertain.

Tennessee Swimming & Diving Prepares for a Packed Week of Competition



Tennessee swimming and diving athletes are set for a packed week, with 19 competitors participating in three major events.

Fourteen swimmers, includ-

ing world champion Jordan Crooks, will compete at the Short Course World Championships in Budapest, December 10-15. Crooks is joined by standout teammates Gui Caribe, Lamar Taylor, and Olympian Kira Toussaint, among others.

At the USA Diving Winter National Championships in Indiana, five Vol divers, led by SEC honoree Bennett Greene, will take on various events.

Tennessee also faces Kentucky in a dual meet on Friday in Lexington, giving younger athletes a chance to shine as top competitors are away. Fans can follow the action live on the Meet Mobile app.


Tennessee Men's Basketball Rises to No. 1 in National Polls





The University of Tennessee men's basketball team has ascended to the top spot in both the AP Top 25 and USA TODAY Coaches Poll, marking the program's first No. 1 ranking in non-conference play. Tennessee (8-0) joins Kansas as the only teams to claim the top position this season.

This achievement is the sixth time Tennessee has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, with five of those instances under head coach Rick Barnes, now in his 10th season. The Volunteers have been ranked in the AP Poll for 65 consecutive weeks, the third-longest active streak in the nation.

Tennessee's dominance extends beyond rankings. The team has led by 26 or more points in all eight games this season, never trailing by more than three points in any contest. Last week, the Volunteers cruised to a 96-70 win over Syracuse in the SEC/ACC Challenge, led by fifth-year guard Chaz Lanier's 26 points. The Vols earned 58 of 62 first-place AP votes and top NCAA NET and KenPom rankings. Tennessee is among nine SEC teams ranked in at least one poll and will face Miami on Tuesday in the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden. The game begins at 6:30 p.m. ET on ESPN.

Update: Two Monroe Co. Corrections Officers Indicted

In an update to yesterday's press release from the Monroe Co. Sheriff's Office, two former Monroe County corrections officers, Caleb Anthony Kirkland, 30, and Ava Hensley, 24, face official misconduct charges following a Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) probe into contraband at the Monroe County Jail.

The investigation, initiated in 2022 at the request of then-10th Judicial District Attorney General Steve Crump, identified Kirkland and Hensley as responsible for bringing or enabling contraband to enter the jail. On December 4, a Monroe County Grand Jury indicted Kirkland on one count of official misconduct and Hensley on three counts.

Both were arrested without incident and booked into the Monroe County Jail. Kirkland was released on his own recognizance, while Hensley was issued a \$3,000 bond.

Authorities emphasize that the charges are accusations, and both defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty in court. The investigation is ongoing.
