#### Lookout Mountain Fire Sparked by Rockslide, Authorities Say



The brush fire on Lookout Mountain this past weekend was sparked by a rockslide, investigators confirmed Wednesday. The fire, which started early Saturday morning, caused significant damage to the Lookout Mountain Incline Railway, requiring months of repair.

The National Park Service reported that a "freeze/thaw action" likely triggered the rockslide around 5:30 a.m., sending large boulders down the mountain toward Ochs Highway. The falling rocks struck trees and stationary boulders, generating sparks and heat. A tree toppled during the slide also hit a power line near the Hardy Trail, but officials determined the rockslide itself was the main cause of the fire. No evidence of human activity was found in the steep area where the blaze began. The wild-fire, now fully contained, will continue to be monitored under current conditions.



#### Etowah Friendly Garden Club Donates \$1,500 to Boys and Girls Club





The Etowah Friendly Garden Club has donated \$1,500 to the Ocoee Region Boys and Girls Club, which is establishing a new facility in Etowah. Construction has begun on a building across from the Etowah City Pool on Louisiana Avenue. Funds for the donation came from the club's Annual Plant Sale, held each year before Mother's Day, which supports community projects. Founded in the late 1940s, the Etowah Friendly Garden Club focuses on gardening education and community service. The club meets monthly on every second Tuesday at the Etowah Community Center. #### Annual Shop with an Elk Held

Christmas came early for 77 kids on Saturday, December 7, 2024, when the Athens Elks Lodge #1927 hosted its annual Shop With An Elk giftgiving event. Now in its fourth year, the program gives children the opportunity to shop online at the Athens Elks Lodge for their Christmas wish lists and receive those gifts from Santa during the gift-giving event. This year, kids asked for Spidey, Bluey, Disney princesses, and Minecraft characters and they also got clothes and shoes. The gift-giving event on December 7 was a whirlwind of activity with Santa handing out sacks of toys, cookie decorating, hot chocolate to drink, and Polar Express playing. After the kids met with Santa and got their gifts, they were invited to decorate Christmas cookies donated by Dianne Stevens-Pupard and Richard Pupard, owners of Grandma's Gingerbread Bakery. Scouts from Sea Scouts Ship 0015 in Athens helped with distributing gifts and entertaining the kids. Elks members fundraise throughout the year for this event, and the number of kids included in the program is dependent on the amount of money the lodge members can raise. This year, the Athens Lodge #1927 also received a \$3,000 grant for Shop With An Elk from the Elks National Foundation. Families can apply to be part of the Shop With An Elk program in the fall. Teachers and Health Connect America identify students who may benefit from the program, and applications are distributed through the Athens City Schools and McMinn County schools. The Lodge works with the McMinn County Rescue Squad to ensure children are included in only one shopping program. The program accepts applications on a first-come, first-served basis, but children whose families are unhoused are prioritized. If families have needs outside of gifts, Lodge members will work to fulfill those needs. This year, Athens Elks Lodge #1927 provided a crib to one family and a toddler bed for another, both made possible through donations from Lodge members. One unique part of the Shop With An Elk program is that non-school-aged siblings are included in the program. Several families provided wish lists for babies, which typically include diapers and wipes. The number of children included in the program is limited only by the amount of money raised for the program. The Lodge budgets and spends approximately \$100 per child. **Source: Kristin Schrader**

#### Vols Baseball Announces 2025 Schedule

The defending national champion Tennessee Volunteers have revealed their 2025 schedule, featuring 38 home games, 15 road contests, and three neutral-site matchups. The Vols open with an eight-game homestand at Lindsey Nelson Stadium, beginning with a series against Hofstra from February 14-16.

Tennessee will participate in the Astros Foundation College Classic at Minute Maid Park in Houston from February 28 to March 2, facing Oklahoma State, Rice, and Arizona. SEC play begins March 14-16 with a marquee home series against Florida, a 2024 College World Series semifinalist. Other notable matchups include a home rematch with Texas A&M (April 4-6) and road series at Ole Miss, LSU, and Arkansas.

The Vols' 2025 schedule includes 28 games against NCAA tournament teams, with nine matchups against 2024 College World Series participants. The SEC Tournament will feature a new single-elimination format with all 16 teams competing in Hoover, Alabama.
