Intense Fire Destroys Etowah Home



A structure fire on County Road 905 in Etowah Saturday afternoon resulted in a total loss. Fire crews arrived at 1:30 PM to find the home fully engulfed in flames. The homeowner, who was present at the time, believes the fire may have started on the front porch, though the exact cause remains unknown.

Known. The blaze was so intense that it ignited a natural gas line buried 19 inches underground, causing an explosion with flames shooting from the ground. 

Man Charged in Madisonville Fentanyl Bust



The Madisonville Police Department said a man was charged after an investigation led to hundreds of fentanyl pills being seized.

According to MPD, Stephen Wattenbarger was charged for the sale and delivery of over 50 grams of fentanyl after a months-long investi-

gation.

MPD said hundreds of fentanyl pills and several hundred dollars in cash were seized. "This operation is a crucial win for our community, helping to remove this dangerous substance from our streets," MPD said. Wattenbarger is being held without bond at the McMinn County Justice Center on other drug charges.



National Gas Prices Remain Steady at \$3.02



The national average for a gallon of gas remains nearly unchanged at \$3.02, with prices hovering near this level for five weeks. Despite low demand and cheaper oil, prices

show little movement. However, 31 states now report averages below \$3.

Gasoline demand rose slightly last week to 8.81 million barrels per day, while domestic gasoline stocks increased by 5.1 million barrels, according to the Energy Information Administration (EIA).

The EIA also reports that hybrid and electric vehicles hit a record 21.2% of sales in Q3 2024. The average cost for public EV charging remains 34 cents per kilowatt-hour.

UT Men's Basketball Remains Undefeated




The No. 1 Tennessee Volunteers secured a dramatic 66-64 victory over Illinois in their first non-conference true road game as the nation's top-ranked team. Senior guard Jordan Gainey led the way with 23 points, including the game-winning layup at the buzzer, as Tennessee improved to 10-0.

In a game featuring 14 ties and 13 lead changes, the Volunteers overcame foul trouble and a strong Illinois start. Tennessee led 31-30 at halftime after a first half dominated by free throws, with both teams shooting under 25% from the field.

Illinois (7-3) took a six-point lead in the second half, but Tennessee rallied behind Gainey's scoring and timely plays by senior forward Igor Miličić Jr., who had seven points and 14 rebounds. The Volunteers held Illinois without a field goal for the final 4:55 and committed no turnovers in the second half.

Lady Vols Break Records in 139-59 Win Over NC Central



The No. 19/18 Tennessee Lady Volunteers put on a historic performance Saturday, shattering NCAA, SEC, and program records in a dominant 139-59 victory over North Carolina Central at Food City Center.

Tennessee, now 8-0 under first-year head coach Kim Caldwell, set a new NCAA single-game record with 30 three-pointers, surpassing the previous mark of 28. The Lady Vols attempted 63 shots from beyond the arc, another SEC record, and broke the program and conference record for points scored in a game.

Senior guard Samara Spencer led the offensive explosion, scoring a career-high 33 points and setting a Tennessee record with nine three-pointers. She also notched 10

assists, earning her first double-double as a Lady Vol.

Redshirt sophomore Talaysia Cooper and fifth-year guard Tess Darby added five three-pointers each, scoring 21 and 17 points, respectively. Tennessee's depth was on full display, with six players scoring in double figures.

The Lady Vols' defense was equally impressive, forcing NC Central into 44 turnovers—just shy of the program record. Tennessee capitalized on those miscues, scoring 73 points off turnovers.

How It Happened

Tennessee opened with a 20-0 run, overwhelming NC Central early and building a 33-10 lead by the end of the first quarter. By halftime, the Lady Vols led 69-18 and had already tied the school record for three-pointers in a game with 16.

The offense stayed hot in the second half, with Tennessee scoring 42 points in the third quarter, their second-highest total for a single period in program history. The team continued to pile on points, breaking the SEC and Tennessee scoring record late in the game with a three-pointer from Destinee Wells.

Up Next

The Lady Vols head to Memphis on Wednesday to take on the Tigers at FedExForum. Tipoff is slated for 8:30 p.m. ET (7:30 CT), with the contest televised by ESPNews. Then the Lady Vols will travel to Florida for two games at the West Palm Beach Classic, meeting Richmond on Friday at 2:15 p.m. ET and following with an 11 a.m. ET tilt on Saturday vs. Tulsa before heading home.

Season Highlights

- Tennessee has reached the 100-point mark in four games this season.
- The team has forced opponents into 20 or more turnovers in six games, including four with over 30 turnovers.
- Eight different players have started a game this season, showcasing the Lady Vols' depth and versatility.
