McMinn Co. Woman Charged after Stabbing Incident



A McMinn County woman, Laurel Williams, 49, faces charges of aggravated assault after allegedly forcing her way into a residence and stabbing three women on Thursday night.

According to Sheriff Joe Guy, deputies responded to a call on County Road 750 around 10 p.m., finding the victims—Amber Gerber, 40, Tosha Goodner, 49, and Amanda Goodner, 34 with serious injuries. Williams was detained on the scene by a • male resident, Tyler Goodner.

Sheriff Guy reported that Williams, who had been asked to leave the residence due to drug use, became upset, retrieved a knife from a nearby barn, and returned to commit the stabbings. Several children were present during the incident. The victims were transported to local hospitals for treatment. Williams remains in the McMinn County Jail on three counts of aggravated assault with a \$45,000 bond.

150 Employees Affected from Athens UPS Facility Closure




The UPS facility located at 2205 Lawn Street in Athens, Tennessee, will temporarily close due to the recent fire, resulting in the separation of 150 employees effective January 10, 2025. This includes both union and non-union workers, according to a notice provided under the Federal Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification

(WARN) Act.

Union employees, represented by the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, have bumping rights under the applicable collective bargaining agreement. Impacted union members may contact Wes Trotterchaud at **Teamsters Local No. 519**, located at 2306 Montclair Ave, Knoxville, Tennessee, 37917.

UPS stated that the closure is temporary, and all affected employees were notified of the reduction in force on December 20, 2024.

Volunteer Football National Champion Dreams Put to Bed



The seventh-ranked Tennessee Volunteers were defeated by No. 6 Ohio State, 42-17, Saturday night in the first round of the 2024 College Football Playoff at Ohio Stadium. Despite the loss, the Vols capped off another impressive season under head coach Josh Heupel, finishing 10-3. This marks Tennessee's second 10-win campaign in the last three seasons, with the program's 30 victories since 2022 being the most in a three-year span since 1998-2000.

Game Highlights:

- Nico Iamaleava: The redshirt freshman quarterback finished 14-for-31 with 104 passing yards, 47 rushing yards, and two rushing touchdowns. Iamaleava became the first freshman quarterback in Tennessee history to achieve a 10 -win season.
- Peyton Lewis: The freshman running back led the team with 77 rushing yards on 10 carries.
- Bru McCoy: The wide receiver led Tennessee's receiving corps with four catches for 40 yards.
- Tennessee's defense logged seven tackles for loss, closing the season with 100 TFLs, tied for the eighth-most in program history. Jeremiah Telander led the Vols with a career-high 10 tackles.

Ohio State (11-2) dominated early, building a 21-0 lead in the first quarter. Tennessee fought back in the second quarter, cutting the deficit to 21-10 at halftime, thanks to a field goal by Max Gilbert and a two-yard touchdown run by Iamaleava.

The Buckeyes pulled away in the second half, scoring touchdowns on their first three drives. Tennessee added a late touchdown with Iamaleava's second rushing score. While the Vols fell short of advancing, the team continues to build under Heupel, who has led Tennessee to remarkable consistency and success. *Source: UTSports.com*
