TBI Identifies Man Dead after I-40 Standoff


The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) has identified James Cody John, 34, of Cookeville, as the man who died following a standoff on Interstate 40 near the Cumberland/Roane County line on Friday.


Around 7am CST, John reportedly shot two individuals at the Hutchinson Plant. One victim was transported to a local hospital, and the other to a Nashville hospital. Both remain in stable condition. John fled the scene, prompting a pursuit by law enforcement down I-40. The chase ended near the Cumberland/Roane County line, where John barricaded himself in his car. Negotiations were attempted, but John was later found deceased from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. The standoff prompted the closure of I-40 in both directions. The eastbound lanes reopened around 2 p.m., and westbound lanes reopened at 12:45 p.m. A nearby accident involving a semi-truck occurred during the closures, but no serious injuries were reported.

The TBI is leading the investigation into the incident at the request of Roane County Attorney General Russell Johnson.


Porch Pirates (Continued)

Sgt. Jason Lee arrived and spoke with Dann Mekkers, who said he had noticed packages missing from his front porch and after reviewing his security cameras, saw a male suspect come up and take the packages and run back to a maroon or burgundy car driven by a separate person. Sgt. Lee looked through social media and saw a similar vehicle suspected in the same type of thefts recently in Bradley County.

Sgt. Lee notified Detective Amber Cook, who was contacted by Detectives in Bradley County who believed that they had developed a suspect living in Riceville that might be involved in both their cases as well as the one in McMinn County. The group of detectives developed a case and made contact with suspect Johnathan Witt, 24, of County Road 759 in Riceville. Witt was at the time in custody in the Bradley County Jail.

"Presented with the evidence, Mr. Witt confessed to taking packages in both McMinn and Bradley Counties, and also in Hamilton County," said Sheriff Guy. "It appears Witt and his girlfriend, Brianna Ervin, 27, of Athens, were operating a Door Dash delivery business and while on deliveries, would steal packages they saw while making deliveries." Some of the property was recovered and both Witt and Ervin charged. Ervin was located at the residence on County Road 759 and was taken to the Bradley County Jail.

"Unfortunately, this type of crime is common around the holidays," said Sheriff Guy. "We hope homeowners will track packages closely, be observant for suspicious vehicles, and try to get packages inside as quickly as possible."

SEC Documentary Coming to Netflix, Tennessee Vols to be Featured



Netflix announced an upcoming eight-episode docuseries focusing on Southeastern Conference (SEC) football during the 2024 season. Produced by Box To Box Films, creators of *Formula 1*: Drive to Survive, the series will offer behind-the-scenes access to players, coaches, locker rooms, and more.

SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey highlighted the series as a showcase of the league's drama and tradition for a global audience. The University of Tennessee confirmed its involvement, with Netflix crews filming at games and press conferences, including quarterback Nico Iamaleava.

The series will premiere on Netflix next summer.

Tennessee Men's Basketball Ranked No. 1 for Third Consecutive Week

The University of Tennessee men's basketball team remains atop both the AP Top 25 and USA TODAY Coaches Poll for the third week in a row. The undefeated Volunteers (11-0) continue their dominant streak under head coach Rick Barnes, marking their eighth time at No. 1 overall in program history and their seventh No. 1 ranking during Barnes' tenure.

The Vols have maintained a spot in the AP Poll for 67 consecutive weeks, the third-longest active streak nationally. They lead the SEC with consistent top rankings, outpacing traditional powerhouse programs like Kentucky.

Last week, Tennessee secured an 84-36 victory over Western Carolina, with standout performances from guard Chaz Lanier and senior Zakai Zeigler. The win marked one of their most dominant showings in recent history.

Tennessee next faces Middle Tennessee State at Food City Center on Monday, aiming to extend their undefeated run. The game will air on SEC Network at 7 p.m. Source UTSports.com
