## Just In Case You Missed These Stories During Christmas

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office revealed that officials with the City of Sweetwater made questionable credit card purchases totaling more than \$130,000 over the course of nearly a decade. According to the investigation, city officials made purchases totaling \$132,680.03 from December 2014 through June 2023, including at least \$2,615.99 the city paid in taxes and fees. According to the Comptroller's Office, the investigation revealed that officials failed to provide adequate oversight or separate financial duties, failed to establish an adequate prior approval system for purchases, failed to maintain adequate supporting documentation for purchases, failed to maintain adequate supporting documentation for city accounts, routinely paid sales taxes on city purchases and failed to establish adequate written policies governing city purchases. Investigators said city officials "indicated that they have corrected or intend to correct these deficiencies." Source: WVLT.com

Clarksville Police charged 19-year-old Labron Gibson with four counts of Aggravated Assault following an argument they said lead to a shooting inside a Walmart in Clarksville on Christmas Eve. Investigators said Gibson was the primary aggressor in the incident, where he displayed a firearm. The second individual involved acted in defense of his family. K-VA-T Food Stores Inc., operating as Food City, has agreed to pay \$8.49 million to settle allegations under the False Claims Act related to dispensing opioids and other controlled substances without ensuring medical necessity. The settlement includes \$78,621 paid to the states of Virginia and Kentucky for state Medicaid claims. The government alleged that, from 2011 to 2018, 24 Food City pharmacies dispensed medically unnecessary controlled substances, resulting in false claims to federal healthcare programs. These actions, according to officials, contributed to the opioid epidemic and jeopardized patient safety. The claims resolved by the settlement are allegations only. There has been no determination of liability. Source: US Dept of Justice



#### **Eastern Hellbender Nears Extinction**



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has proposed listing the eastern hellbender, a giant salamander found in Tennessee and nearby states, as endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA).


Once abundant, only 59% of the eastern hellbender's historical 626 populations remain, with nearly 60% of those in decline. Only 12% of populations are considered stable. The eastern hellbender, North America's largest salamander, can grow up to 29 inches, live up to 30 years, and primarily resides in perennial streams,

hiding under rocks.

Key threats include habitat loss, water pollution, stream sedimentation, disease, and collection for the pet trade. The species, often called "snot otters," is considered vital for maintaining freshwater ecosystem health.

If listed as endangered, protections will prohibit harming, removing, or harassing the species, and federal agencies will need to coordinate with the Fish and Wildlife Service to ensure its conservation.

### Dont'e Thornton Jr. Declares for 2025 NFL Draft



After leading the Tennessee Volunteers in receiving during the 2024 season, wide receiver Dont'e Thornton Jr. announced his decision to enter the 2025 NFL Draft. Thornton capped his college career with a productive year, recording 661 receiving yards, six touchdowns, and averaging an impressive 25.4 yards per catch.

Thornton, a transfer from Oregon, overcame injuries and adjustments in his first year at Tennessee in 2023 to emerge as a key big-play threat in 2024. He led the FBS with six catches of 50+ yards and was responsible for five of Tennessee's six longest plays of the season, including an 86-yard touchdown against Vanderbilt and a 73-yard score versus Mississippi State. Despite battling a knee issue throughout the season,

Thornton recorded three 100-yard games and multiple highlight-reel performances.

Over his collegiate career, Thornton amassed 1,412 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns across stints at Oregon and Tennessee. The 6-foot-5, 214-pound wideout, a former four-star recruit from Baltimore, Maryland, completed his degree in communication studies this month and now turns his focus to the next chapter as he prepares for the NFL Draft.

Thornton thanked the Vols and their fans for their support, reflecting on his journey of resilience and growth during his time in Knoxville.
