## Celebrating Jeff Derrick's Hard Work and Dedication at Athens Utilities Board





## Tennessee Unemployment Rates for November 2024

The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD) announced on Thursday that 91 of Tennessee's 95 counties reported unemployment rates of less than 5% for November, with unemployment rates decreasing in 17 counties. Moore and Williamson counties recorded the state's lowest unemployment rates for November at 2.6%. Those counties also reported rates of 2.6% in October. Sevier County had the state's next-lowest unemployment rate for the month.

At 2.7%, the rate was one-tenth of a percentage point higher than in October. Unicoi County in Northeast Tennessee recorded the state's highest unemployment rate for November at 6%. That was a two-tenths of a percentage point increase over its October rate of 5.8%. Bledsoe County followed with a rate for November at 5.4%. Bledsoe's rate in October was 5.1%. McNairy County reported the third-highest rate for the month at 5.3%, an uptick of one-tenth of a percentage point over its October rate. The unemployment rate in Weakley County — which reported the highest rate in Tennessee in October — dropped 2 full percentage points in November to 3.9%.

Unemployment rates remained the same in 30 counties, while rates in 48 counties increased from October to November. Area Unemployment rates appear in the chart below:

### Area News

- ♦ A drone and K-9 deputy helped track down drug suspects in Rhea County last Saturday, December 21. The Rhea County Sheriff's Office responded to the area of Walden Mountain Road in Spring City after a 9-1-1 hang-up call. Upon arrival, deputies found two individuals on the side of the road. Both ran and were eventually tracked down by a drone. The K-9 deputies led authorities to the suspects. When arrested, the suspects told officers that they were involved in a single vehicle wreck. The car was later found upside down in the woods. James Holland and Angel Bullington now face charges for evading arrest and public intoxication. Holland also faces a charge for resisting arrest. - ♦ The Sweetwater Police Department reports that three people are facing charges after several items were reportedly stolen from a Dollar General in Sweetwater. On December 19, officers responded to a burglary at the Dollar General on North Main Street, which was closed due to an arson incident. At the store, the Sweetwater Police Department said officers found a woman who was attempting to steal items. She was taken into custody. This incident led officers to review additional surveillance footage. This footage showed other people involved in recent burglaries at the store. SPD said detectives then investigated multiple residences, recovering over \$600 worth of stolen property and arresting two additional people on burglary charges.

In a Social Media post on Facebook, the SPD stated: "We would like to remind the public that, regardless of the circumstances, it is illegal to enter and steal property that does not belong to you. The investigation remains ongoing, and officers are reviewing hours of surveillance footage to identify any other individuals involved,". Source WATE 6 News




