McMinn Senior Activity Center Offers Free Computer Classes for Seniors



The McMinn Senior Activity Center has announced the return of the *Tech Goes Home* computer classes to be held at the Center. This computer literacy program for older adults aged 60 and up will begin on Monday, February 10, 2025, and includes 15 hours of digital skills training. The classes are from 8:30 am until 11:30 am and will run the entire week through Friday February 14, 2025. When they finish their 15 hours, participants will be able to take a Chromebook computer home with them.

The Southeast TN Area Agency on Aging and Disability (SETAAAD) is partnering with *Tech Goes Home Tennessee* and the McMinn Senior Activity Center for Older Adults Tech Classes. These computer classes include 15 hours of instruction and a Chromebook computer and mouse

upon completion. Classes are open to the public who are 60 and older, a resident of Southeast Tennessee and a first-time class participant. 



New Tennessee Laws Effective January 1, 2025

Starting **January 1, 2025**, several new Tennessee laws will take effect:


Juvenile Justice Reform: A blended sentencing law allows juveniles convicted of violent crimes to serve both juvenile and adult sentences, closing loopholes and holding offenders accountable.

Healthcare Efficiency: Hospitals and doctors must accept electronic insurance cards as valid proof of insurance, streamlining patient visits.

Land Protection: New rules prohibit hostile foreign entities from owning Tennessee land, requiring divestment within two years. An Office of Agriculture Intelligence will oversee enforcement.

These laws aim to improve public safety, healthcare access, and protect state assets.
