Fire Destroys Etowah Property, 1 Injured

Athens Fire Causes Extensive Damage



Early Monday morning, a barn on County Road 804 in Etowah was found fully engulfed in flames upon the arrival of fire personnel. The blaze resulted in the total loss of the barn, a 2021 motor home, a G-3 boat, a 2007 Kubota tractor,

two lawnmowers, tools, and other belongings. The cause of the fire remains undetermined.

During the response, a neighbor experienced chest pains while assisting by using a water hose to cool the portion of the house closest to the barn. He was transported to Starr Regional Hospital in Etowah by AMR. Multiple agencies, including Etowah Rural Fire, Claxton Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department, responded to the scene under the command of Etowah Rural Fire Chief Adam Hafley.

Late Thursday night, a mobile home on County Road 560 in Athens caught fire, originating in the bedroom and quickly spreading

throughout the structure. The fire caused heavy heat and fire damage to the home. The occupants were checked for smoke inhalation but did not suffer any serious injuries.

Englewood Rural Fire, Athens Rural Fire, AMR, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department responded to the scene to assist in controlling the fire and ensuring the safety of those involved.

Tennessee men's basketball dominated No. 23 Arkansas, 76-52, in their SEC opener on Saturday at Food City Center, improving to 14-0 and matching the program's best start in history. Chaz Lanier led the way with a season-high 29 points, in-

cluding five 3-pointers.

Igor Miličić Jr. contributed 13 points, a career-high 18 rebounds, and five assists. Zakai Zeigler added 12 points and seven assists. The Vols' defense was stellar, holding Arkansas to just 37.7% shooting, including a 32.7% mark after the first six minutes. Tennessee dominated the glass, finishing with a 51-29 rebounding advantage. Arkansas struggled offensively, with D.J. Wagner leading their scoring with 17 points, but the

team was limited to just 52 points, marking their lowest total in nearly a year.

The victory marks Tennessee's seventh-largest win over a ranked opponent and the second consecutive year the Vols have opened SEC play with a dominant win over a top-25 team. Next, Tennessee will visit No. 6 Florida on Tuesday at 7 p.m. at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in Gainesville, Fla., broadcast live on ESPN2. *Source: <u>UT Athletics</u>*
