Athens Mayor raises concerns about AMR





AMR, or American Medical Response, is being asked questions by Athens Mayor Larry Eaton about their ambulance service for the citizens of Athens as well as McMinn County. According to A Global Medical Response Solution the Mayor, AMR is supposed to have 5 ambulance

units assigned to McMinn County with at least 3 of those inside the county at all times. In emails the mayor sent to the AMR Regional Director, Joshua Spencer, Eaton says that AMR has left the county with no ambulance units on several occasions. Also, the mayor says that the local AMR responders are understaffed with 8+ members leaving the organization recently for better pay and working conditions elsewhere. Spencer responded in an email and said that he is willing to meet with all those involved in dealing with the ambulance service, however the mayor says he wants any meeting held to be done so publicly, so that citizens will be able to attend and know what's happening. As of this date, no formal meeting has been scheduled.







Game Preview: #1 Tennessee at #8 Florida



The top-ranked Tennessee men's basketball team will play tonight in Gainesville to face No. 8 Florida in its first SEC road contest of the season. *Tipoff is set for 7 p.m. ET and the game will be broadcast on ESPN2*. The Volunteers, fresh off a commanding 76-52 victory over No. 23 Arkansas, matched the best start in program history at 14-0, a mark last achieved in the 1922-23 season. In Saturday's win, Tennessee dominated from the outset, leading by as many as 27 points. Fifth-year guard Chaz Lanier delivered a season-high 29 points—his third consecutive game with 20 or more—while forward Igor Miličić Jr. grabbed a career-best 18 rebounds, the most by a Vol since 2014.

Tennessee holds an 81-63 all-time series lead against Florida, including an 8-2 record over the last 10 meetings. The Volunteers enter Gainesville ranked in the AP top six for the fourth consecutive visit, a testament to their consistency under head coach Rick Barnes. Florida, led by senior guard Walter Clayton Jr., a preseason First Team All-SEC selection averaging 18.3 points and 3.9 assists per game, was projected to finish sixth in the SEC.

Currently the only undefeated team in the nation, Tennessee is riding a 14-game winning streak, the fourth such streak in program history and the third to occur within a single season. The Vols also lead the SEC over the last eight years with a .690 conference winning percentage (87-39). Their defensive prowess remains a cornerstone of success, as they rank first nationally in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency (87.1) and have held opponents under 60 points in 42 consecutive games.

Chaz Lanier has been a standout for Tennessee, leading the SEC with 20.3 points per game and scoring at least 22 points in seven of his last 10 outings. Zakai Zeigler, with 207 career steals, is just five away from breaking Tennessee's all-time record. The Vols also boast an impressive 14-2 all-time record as the No. 1 team in the AP Poll, including a flawless 6-0 this season.

As the Vols look to extend their historic start, Tuesday's matchup against a top-10 Florida team provides an opportunity to solidify their position atop the rankings and continue their dominance in SEC play. <u>UTSPORTS.com</u>
