

Reminder: East TN's new '729' area code will go into effect soon



The Tennessee Public Utility Commission announced last year the addition of the 729 area code to the region currently served by the 423 area code. This change, known as an area code overlay, is being implemented to ensure a continued supply of new phone numbers as the 423 area code is projected to run out by the end of 2025.

Beginning March 5, 2025, <u>NEW</u> phone lines and services in the 423 region—which includes the areas in blue in the graphic shown to the left—will be assigned the 729 area code. The new code will coexist with the 423 area code, meaning <u>all calls</u> within the region will require dialing the area code + phone number.


Key dates to remember:

• February 5, 2025: Dialing 10 digits becomes mandatory for all calls. Calls dialed with only seven digits will not be completed, and you'll need to redial using the area code.

To prepare for the change, residents and businesses should:

- Reprogram devices like speed dialers and medical monitoring systems to include the area code.
- Update contact lists, stationery, websites, and advertising materials to include the area code.
- Begin using the area code when sharing your phone number.

Long-distance calls will continue to require 1 + area code + phone number. For existing 423 numbers, no changes will be necessary aside from the new dialing procedure. This update ensures the region remains well-served as it continues to grow.

Rhea County K-9 and Drones Assist in Suspect Capture




Around midnight on Friday, January 3, the Rhea County Sheriff's Department Tracking K-9 Unit and Emergency Management drones assisted multiple agencies in

locating a suspect who fled on foot following a traffic stop.

The Athens Police Department, McMinn County Sheriff's Department, and Tennessee Highway Patrol initiated the pursuit, which ended in a wooded area near Interstate 75. K-9 Blondie quickly began tracking and located the suspect within minutes in the woodline between the interstate lanes.



Cold Weather and Snow Possible Later This Week



The new year has started with a chill, and below-normal temperatures are expected to persist through the next two weeks. Weather models suggest that a low-pressure system passing to the south could bring a mix of cold air from the north and moisture from the south, potentially resulting in snowfall for the area.

The exact impact will depend on the track of the low. A more northern track could increase the chance of rain, while a southern track raises the likelihood of snow. Timing also varies between models. The GFS model predicts snow as early as 6 a.m. Friday, while the EURO model suggests a later arrival, mid-to-late morning.

Current projections estimate snowfall between 1 to 3+ inches, with the GFS model hinting at lingering snow showers into Saturday. Updated data suggests the snow line may shift further south, potentially increasing snowfall amounts on Friday morning through the night, tapering to lighter snow showers on Saturday.

Temperatures on Friday are forecasted to range from the 20s to low 30s, so residents should prepare for a wintry end to the week. Stay tuned (to WYXI RADIO FM 94.5 AM 1390) for updated forecasts as short-term models provide more clarity by midweek. **Source:** *David Karnes 3 - Facebook*
