Minor Earthquakes Near Englewood on Saturday

Two minor earthquakes shook East Tennessee near Englewood on Saturday afternoon, according to data from the United States Geological Survey (USGS) based at the University of Memphis.

The first earthquake, recorded at a magnitude of 2.1, occurred at 1:23 p.m. local time. The epicenter was located approximately 4.0 km (2.5 miles) north of Englewood and 9.9 km (6.1 miles) east-northeast of Athens, at a depth of 9 km.

The second earthquake, slightly stronger at a magnitude of 2.2, struck just moments later at the same time. Its epicenter was 4.4 km (2.7 miles) north of Englewood and 10.5 km (6.5 miles) east-northeast of Athens, but it originated deeper underground at 16 km.

While these earthquakes were minor and unlikely to have caused damage, they underscore the seismic activity in the region, which sits near the Eastern Tennessee Seismic Zone. Residents in nearby communities may have felt mild vibrations or heard faint rumblings.

The USGS continues to monitor and analyze seismic activity in the area. Residents are reminded that while these small quakes are not uncommon, they are part of the broader geological processes that shape the region.


