
Monroe County Narcotics Unit Seizes Significant Quantities of Drugs

The Monroe County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit and the Monroe County Violent Crime Task Force have been actively conducting operations over the past month, targeting known drug locations and seizing significant quantities of illegal substances.

Recent seizures include:

- **46 grams of methamphetamine** from a residence on North Fork Road in the Madisonville area.
- **18 grams of methamphetamine** from a residence on Scott Street in Tellico Plains.
- 27 grams of fentanyl, 1.7 grams of methamphetamine, 38 grams of marijuana, and \$205 in cash from another residence on Scott Street in Tellico Plains.

Authorities are committed to combating the manufacturing, transportation, and distribution of drugs in the community, working tirelessly to remove these harmful substances from the streets. The names of those involved are being withheld at this time, and the Sheriff's Office reminds the public that all individuals are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. *Source: Sheriff Tommy Jones - Facebook*

TWU Basketball Update

The men's and women's basketball programs at Tennessee Wesleyan each picked up a double-digit win on Monday in their return to the floor at James L. Robb Gymnasium. The teams were hosting the Columbia International University Rams in Appalachian Athletic Conference games.

The women's basketball team pulled away in the fourth quarter in a 74-51 conference win. Anna Crowder led all scorers with 21 points.

The men's basketball team used a late scoring run to help them end the evening with a 76-59 victory against the Rams. Ty Hurst led all scorers with 25 points.

Volunteers secure Top 10 finish under Heupel

The Tennessee Volunteers (10-3, 6-2 SEC) capped a historic 2024 football season with a Top 10 finish in both major polls, marking the program's second such finish in three years under head coach Josh Heupel. The Vols ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 8 in the Amway Coaches Poll, adding to their No. 7 placement in the final College Football Playoff rankings on Dec. 2.

Tennessee achieved the program's first-ever College Football Playoff appearance this season, finishing as the third-highest ranked SEC team. The Vols were one of only 13 Power Four programs to secure 10 regular-season wins. All three of Tennessee's losses came on the road, including matchups against No. 6 Georgia and eventual national champion Ohio State.

This season marked the first time since 1999 and 2001 that Tennessee finished in the Top 10 twice within three years. Heupel's leadership has revitalized the program, which had not achieved a Top 10 finish since its 11-2 campaign in 2001.

The Vols' defense, led by Broyles Award finalist Tim Banks, was a standout unit. Tennessee ranked in the FBS Top 15 in 11 statistical categories, including third in fourth-down conversion defense (31.8%), fifth in yards per play allowed (4.56), and sixth in total defense (293.2 yards per game). The team surrendered just 16.1 points per game-the program's best since the 1998 national championship season-and limited 10 of their 13 opponents to under 20 points.

Offensively, Tennessee ranked 12th in scoring (35.7 points per game) and 15th in total offense (447 yards per game), reflecting their balanced approach. Heupel has guided Tennessee to three consecutive Top 25 finishes, with a total of 30 wins over that span, the fourth-highest in the SEC. The Vols' .769 winning percentage since 2022 ranks eighth in the FBS and third in the SEC. Tennessee is one of only four SEC teams-alongside Georgia, Alabama, and Texas-to finish in the AP Top 25 for three consecutive seasons.

With this year's achievements, Tennessee has solidified its place as a rising power in college football, continuing to build on Heupel's vision for the program.
