Athens Arts Center to Host Exhibits by Regional Black Artists

The Athens Area Council for the Arts (AACA) is proud to showcase two exhibitions celebrating regional Black artists: "I Am Her and She Is Me" by Dominique Pruitt and "No Boundaries" by Calvin Walton. The exhibits will be open to the public from February 10 to March 14, 2025, at The Arts Center, with an Artist Reception on Thursday, February 13, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM, featuring a poetry reading by Dominique Pruitt.

"I Am Her and She Is Me" by Chattanooga artist Dominique Pruitt is an exploration of femininity and self-acceptance. Pruitt, a mixed-media artist and mental health advocate, captures the strength, beauty, and diversity of women through her abstract works. Her paintings, featuring universal skin tones, encourage viewers to see themselves in the art.

"No Boundaries" by Athens-born artist Calvin Walton showcases a diverse range of subjects, from nature and music to the human experience. Using acrylic on wood, mixed media, and resin finishes, Walton creates vivid, expressive pieces that highlight the interplay of color and texture. Now based in Stone Mountain, Georgia, Walton continues to develop his unique artistic voice.

Both exhibits are free and open to the public during regular business hours: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Pruitt's work will be displayed • in the Willson Exhibit Room and Hallway Gallery, while Walton's will be on the Gallery Wall in the Peggy Dow Performance Center. 

Cherokees battle Golden Eagles with mixed results



The Cherokees and Lady Cherokees split their district games against Rhea County this past Friday night. The Lady Cherokees battled hard but eventually fell to the host, Lady Golden Eagles, 62-50. Molly Trentham led McMinn with 20 points followed by Mia

Sewell with 15 points.

The boys game saw the Cherokees pull away for a 65-46 victory. McMinn was led by Reece Frazier with 23 points followed by Jaxson Gonzalez with 14 points and Brady Mullins with 12 points.

The Cherokees and Lady Cherokees traveled to Ooltewah Monday night and are back at home Friday evening hosting Cleveland with the girls game at 6:00 PM and boys game at 7:30 PM.

Vols Ascend to Fourth in National Rankings



Tennessee men's basketball climbed four spots in both the AP Top 25 Poll and the USA TODAY Coaches Poll, landing at No. 4 in both rankings released Monday. The Volunteers have now spent 11

consecutive weeks in the AP Top 10, tying the fifth-longest streak in program history. Under head coach Rick Barnes, Tennessee has been ranked in the AP Poll for 73 straight weeks, the third-longest active streak in the nation behind Houston (99) and Kansas (78).

Tennessee split a pair of top-12 matchups last week, falling 78-73 to No. 12 Kentucky before rebounding with a dominant 64-44 win over No. 5 Florida on Saturday. Despite missing key players Zakai Zeigler and Igor Miličić Jr., the Vols delivered a defensive clinic, led by Chaz Lanier's 19-point performance. The SEC remains a powerhouse in the rankings, with nine teams in the Top 25 of at least one poll.

The Volunteers will face their fifth straight AP Top 15 opponent when they host No. 15/16 Missouri on Wednesday at 7 p.m. in Food City Center, airing live on SEC Network. **Source: UTSports.com**
