Driver Airlifted After Early Morning Crash in Etowah




A serious accident early Tuesday morning left a driver critically injured after crashing head-on into a tree on County Road 609 at County Road 527 in Etowah.

The crash, involving a 2006 Ford Escape, oc-

curred around 12:30 a.m. First responders and AMR treated the driver at the scene before transporting him to a landing zone at Goodsprings Baptist Church, set up by Etowah Rural Fire and Etowah City Fire Departments. Cleveland State Awarded Rural Healthcare Grant


Cleveland State Community College was awarded a \$500,000 Rural Healthcare Grant from the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development to expand healthcare programs in COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Cleveland State Community College was awarded a \$300,000 the college's five county service area of Bradley, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe and Polk counties.

The grant is a partnership between the Adult Education, Workforce Development, Healthcare departments at the college and local healthcare employers. Adult Education will provide services for students in workforce preparedness and skill upgrading in math and reading as well as career planning. Workforce Development will provide short-term bootcamps in entry-level healthcare careers such as Phlebotomy, Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) and Medical Billing and Coding. Tuition assistance will be available for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) basic and paramedic courses. Grant funds will also provide tuition, gas and childcare assistance to qualified students enrolled in the bootcamps.

"Cleveland State Adult Education is excited to offer financial assistance to individuals interested in healthcare programs who otherwise wouldn't be able to attend," said Angela Cooper, Adult Education Director. "We are looking forward to strengthening community employer partnerships by providing a pipeline of talented and skilled individuals."

The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development is leading efforts to address workforce shortages across various industries, with healthcare as a priority. Governor Bill Lee is prioritizing initiatives to improve rural healthcare. As the demand for healthcare services continues to grow, the challenge of recruiting and retaining talent is compounded by barriers that students face, such as limited financial support and training opportunities. This initiative aims to strengthen the pipeline of healthcare professionals in rural communities. UT v. Missouri Tonight

The fourth-ranked Tennessee Volunteers continue their tough stretch of conference matchups as they take on No. 15/16 Missouri on Wednesday night at 7 p.m. ET at Food City Center. The game, Tennessee's fifth consecutive contest against a top-15 SEC opponent, will be broadcast on SEC Network with Roy Philpott and Jimmy Dykes on the call. Fans can also listen live via the Vol Network, featuring Bob Kesling and Steve Hamer.

Tennessee (18-4, 5-4 SEC) is coming off a dominant 64-44 victory over No. 5/6 Florida on Saturday, despite missing two key starters - senior guard Zakai Zeigler and senior forward Igor Miličić Jr. Chaz Lanier led the Volunteers with 19 points, helping the team improve to 7-1 all-time in AP top-10 home matchups. Head coach Rick Barnes remains undefeated (6-0) at home against AP top-five opponents while at Tennessee.

Wednesday's matchup against Missouri (17-4, 6-2 SEC) marks another crucial test for the Volunteers as they continue their battle for positioning in the SEC standings.
