
#### Results of Athens City Council Called Meeting

The Athens City Council held a called meeting on Tuesday. Two points passed on the agenda.

- 1. Southeast Tennessee Development (SETD) will be helping the city obtain a \$1 million grant to help with safety concerns for the Downtown and Knight Park areas. This will help create crosswalks for TWU students and citizens to cross streets while ensuring safety when going to and from classes. This will also will help the Arts Council when they have events and use TWU and surrounding private parking areas for overflow parking.
- 2. The City Council has chosen to shut down Facebook comments specifically on the live streams of the meetings, after a 3-1 vote. However, it is unclear if this will also extend to the rest of their social content.

Mayor Larry Eaton stated that these live streams were created so that people could stay informed of the events at the meetings whenever they were unable to physically attend. However, he stated, "Now people [are] making very bad comments and that isn't what it is for."

#### **Community Pitch Competition at Cleveland State**

Modeled after the popular television show, Shark Tank, the winners of the competition will receive seed money to invest in their established business provided by the Lynn Jones Foundation. First place will receive \$7,500; second place will receive \$4,000, and third place will receive \$1,500.

The competition is open to any new business in Bradley, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe or Polk counties that has been in operation for at least six months but no longer than two years. #### **TWU Athletic Report**

It's been an exciting time in Tennessee Wesleyan University Athletics. The basketball teams are nearing the end of their regular seasons as baseball, men's and women's tennis, and men's lacrosse are starting their seasons for 2025. Here are the latest updates:

The baseball program finished their time in Florida at the East/West Challenge with three wins. The team defeated No. 24 University of British Columbia, No. 10 Arizona Christian University, and No. 2 Hope International University.

The men's tennis team made a run at the ITA NAIA Men's Team Indoor Championships. The team made it all the way to the championship match, defeating No. 14 Lindsey Wilson College and No. 2 Keiser University. The fifth-ranked Bulldogs fell in the title match to No. 1 Georgia Gwinnett. The sixth-ranked women's tennis team picked up a win against No. 18 Williams Woods University at the ITA NAIA Women's Team Indoor Championships.

The men's lacrosse team began their season with a 14-3 win against NCAA Division II opponent Shorter University. Kennedy Moore led the offense with five goals.

The men's basketball team tied a program record in their most recent home game against St. Andrews University. In the team's 125-78 win, the Bulldogs made 51 field goals to tie the record for most made field goals in a game. The women's basketball team have won three of their last four games, beating Welch College, Brenau University, and St. Andrews University.

## Two Felony Suspects Captured After Pursuits



On Tuesday, February 4, officers attempted a traffic stop on a burglary suspect who fled, leading authorities on a pursuit through Loudon County. Deputies deployed spike strips, safely stopping the vehicle and

arresting the suspect.

Shortly after, a second wanted felon fled from officers on I-75 South, leading to another chase that ended in Meigs County after authorities disabled the vehicle.

The first suspect was driving a stolen short bus and had felony warrants in Hamilton County. The second, a convicted felon on probation, was wanted in Knox and McMinn counties. Both face multiple felony charges. Multiple agencies assisted in the arrests. All suspects are presumed innocent until proven guilty.

## Fatal Crash in Meigs County Claims Life of 24-Year-Old Man



A 24-year-old Tennessee man, **Austin Justice**, was killed in a single-vehicle crash early Thursday morning on State Highway 60 in Meigs County.

According to the Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP), the crash occurred just before 7 a.m. when Justice, driving a 2006 Nissan Altima, left the roadway, entered a ditch, overturned, and struck a sign and mailbox before coming to a stop.

THP reports that Justice was not wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash. The incident remains under investigation.
