## Local SAR Chapter committing to preserve Local History at Matlock Family Cemetery



The Hiwassee Chapter Tennessee Society Sons of the American Revolution (Hiwassee Chapter SAR) is committed to preserving local history. Cemeteries are an often overlooked but important repository for historical information. Over the past year, the members of the Hiwassee SAR Chapter have been working diligently to clean and preserve the Matlock Family Cemetery located on County Road 209 near Niota, Tennessee in the Marshall Hill Community. The Matlock Family Cemetery contains the graves of Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Civil War Veterans. Among the numerous historically significant graves in the cemetery is that of Revolutionary War Patriot Maximillian Rector. Last April local representatives of both the SAR and DAR held a Grave Marking Ceremony to honor Patriot Rector. Rector enlisted as a Private in the Conti-

nental Army in 1776 and was attached to Captain John Ashby's Company in the 3rd Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel Thomas Marshall. Thomas Marshall was the father of Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall. Private Rector was at the Battle of Brandywine in September 1777 and Germantown October 1777 before surviving the horrific conditions at the encampment of Valley Forge the winter of 1777- 1778. Rector's service continued until he was captured by General Clinton's forces during the Siege of Charleston in May 1780. By preserving his final Todays News The Morning Fax" "From Brandywine to Valley Forge to Charleston, resting place, we can do our part to continue to tell his story" stated Hiwassee Chapter SAR President Ed Waldron. Waldron continued, "Unfortunately, despite all the work by our Chapter's members in the cemetery, several mature trees are a threat to continued damage and deterioration to these historic graves and headstones. We need some monetary help from the community to remove these trees and save these important historic assets." The Hiwassee Chapter SAR is currently seeking donations for the removal of trees and restoration of headstones at Matlock Family Cemetery. The fundraising goal is \$10,000 and donations can be sent payable to SAR PO Box 307 Philadelphia, TN 37846. "We know that our community is very patriotic and values history. Any help would be appreciated in this preservation effort" said Waldron in closing.

# **TDOT Plans I-75 Expansion**

The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) is planning to expand a section of I-75 to accommodate increasing traffic in Loudon County, one of the fastest-growing communities in East Tennessee.

The project aims to widen I-75 from the I-40/75 split to the Lenoir City exit, expanding the highway from two lanes to three in each direction. Officials believe the expansion is necessary to address congestion caused by the area's rapid population growth.

Local businesses have also seen an increase in out-of-state customers. Mary Bright, owner of The Sparkly Pig in Lenoir City, said many of her patrons are newcomers from other states.

City officials agree the interstate expansion is long overdue and will support future growth. "That's a major choke point for a lot of folks," said Amber Scott Kelso, City Administrator for Lenoir City, emphasizing the need for improved infrastructure.

TDOT plans to begin construction in 2027, using funds from the Transportation Modernization Fund, though an exact completion date has not been set.




