Madisonville Police Capture Suspect after Two-Day Search

The Madisonville Police Department apprehended Joey Miller, 26, on Tuesday morning, two days after he allegedly stole a vehicle and evaded capture.

Officers responded to a laundromat on Englewood Road on Saturday after receiving a report of a stolen vehicle. The next day, an officer spotted the stolen car during patrol and attempted to stop it, but the driver fled on foot.

Police received a tip on Miller's location Tuesday morning. When officers Morning Fax arrived, Miller again attempted to Today's News. This Morning. flee on foot but was quickly caught.

Miller faces multiple charges, including felony theft, evading arrest, and possession of methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia. He has been booked into the Monroe County Justice Center.

Large Donation to TWU fully funds Old College Restoration



Tennessee Wesleyan University is thrilled to announce a significant contribution from the Dr. Mintie Cantrell Willson Family to fully fund the tuckpointing project in an ongoing restoration effort for the Old College building. This generous gift underscores the Willson family's deep commitment to preserving the cultural heritage of our campus and ensuring that future generations can experience the rich history this iconic structure represents.

Old College, completed in 1858, would become the core of a college ultimately known as Tennessee Wesleyan University. The three-story brick building has served every purpose on the campus, was used as an American Civil War hospital, served as the original home of the McMinn County Living Heritage Museum, and is currently the home to the Religion and Philosophy Department, the TWU Honor's Program, Sam and Stella Roberts Library and Conference Room, and offices of the President and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

During the dedication ceremony held last Friday, Tennessee Wesleyan University President Dr. Tyler Forrest said, "It is an extreme honor to celebrate the Willson family, a family whose support has spanned decades not only on the TWU campus, but the entire community."

In honor of the Willson family contribution, the parlor in Lawrence Hall, whose picturesque windows look out to the campus quad and Old College, was named "Mintie's Parlor" in honor of Dr. Willson's many years of dedication and service to the university.

"Tennessee Wesleyan University continues to be a big part of this community; it is one of our biggest assets," said Dr. Willson. "Athens is very blessed not just to have a university, but to have it located downtown."


