

Wynn Expands Christian Broadcasting to 44 Million Homes



Pastor Anthony Wynn of Miracle Deliverance Tabernacle in Riceville, TN, continues to grow Greater Love TV (GLTV), a Christian network launched in August 2023 to help ministries share the Gospel affordably. TN Bill proposes \$20 Minimum Wage



A new bill introduced in the Tennessee General Assembly proposes an increase in Tennessee's minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$20 per hour. If House Bill 1399 passes into law, Tennessee would have the highest minimum wage in the country. The same bill failed in 2024, but this year the bill's sponsor, Repre-

sentative Justin Pearson (Memphis), says he has more support. Tennessee is one of 20 states that have minimum wage set at the federal minimum of \$7.25 per hour. Rep. Pearson says he understands that it would be the highest in the country, but he says Tennessee should be a leader in livable wages. *Source: Local 3 News*

Gov. Lee Signs Education Freedom Act into Law



Gov. Bill Lee has signed the Education Freedom Act, landmark legislation that establishes Tennessee's first-ever universal school choice program. The Governor was joined by members of the Tennessee General Assembly and stakeholders, including dozens of Tennessee families, students and educators, to celebrate the Education Freedom Act's passage into law with his signature.
