Three-Year-Old Mauled by Pit Bull in Englewood

An evening at a babysitter's home turned tragic when a three-year-old child was mauled by a pit bull on County Road 564 in Englewood around 6:30 p.m. Sunday.

According to reports, the dog had wandered to the babysitter's residence about a month ago in a malnourished state. The babysitter's boyfriend, who was outside working on a vehicle, heard the child screaming near a swing set and discovered the attack.

The child sustained lacerations and puncture wounds to the face and head and was treated on the scene by AMR and Englewood Rural Fire Department. Lifeforce airlifted the child to Children's Hospital at Erlanger for further treatment.

McMinn County Animal Control removed the dog from the residence, and McMinn County Sheriff's Corporal Nathan Stiles is investigating the incident.

Sweetwater Bus Driver Faces Assault Charges, Banned from Driving



A Sweetwater City Schools bus driver is facing assault and reckless endangerment charges after allegedly yelling at students, slamming the brakes, and grabbing a child's jacket during a morning route on February 28.

According to an affidavit of complaint, **Wendell Cleve Rice** was driving when security footage showed him yelling at a second and fifth grader, slamming the brakes, and later grabbing a student's jacket, pulling him closer, and demanding silence. The report also alleges that Rice threatened to punch another student if he didn't sit down.


Following the incident, Sweetwater City Morning Fax Schools stated that Rice, who was employed by KB Busing, was immediately banned from driving any school routes. The district notified parents, school resource officers, and the bus contractor, confirming that Rice will not be allowed to drive in the future.

Rodney Boruff, Director of Sweetwater City Schools released a statement detailing the events and pending investigation as well as saying that: "Sweetwater City Schools is committed to providing a safe environment for all students and will always advocate for all students to feel safe and valued."

Cleveland State to Host Entrepreneurship Event and Pitch Competitions

The George R. Johnson Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation at Cleveland State Community College will host an Entrepreneurship Event on Tuesday, March 25, featuring student and community pitch competitions and the grand opening of the new Center.
