Monroe County resumes motorcycle patrols for traffic safety



The Monroe County Sheriff's Office, in partnership with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office, is resuming motorcycle patrols to improve traffic safety and reduce crashes on popular riding routes, including the Cherohala Skyway and highways leading to the

"Dragon."

With 41 motorcycle-related accidents reported last year, the program will focus on speed enforcement and rider education to enhance road safety. These efforts also aim to address resident complaints about high-speed traffic.

Chief Deputy Chris White emphasized the county's commitment to ensuring a safe and positive experience for both residents and visitors. The initiative is funded by a grant from the Tennessee Highway Safety Office.

Cleveland State Student Spotlight: Tammy Johnson Reflects on Career, Leadership, and Next Steps



After 35 years in Cleveland, Tammy Johnson is preparing for her next chapter. Johnson, who led Habitat for Humanity of Cleveland for over seven years as CEO, will step down in June to support the transition to new leader David Gray before relocating to Birmingham with her husband.

Johnson's journey began when she arrived in Cleveland and enrolled at Cleveland State Community College, working as a student employee in the President's Office and a switchboard operator, while also cleaning fast-food parking lots at night. She later transferred to Lee University, earning a business degree while working full-time.

Her career included nearly five years at Caldwell Paving, where she gained insight into the construction industry. These experiences prepared her for Habitat for Humanity, where her personal background of growing up in poverty fueled her passion for helping others. She emphasized the importance of Habitat's vetting process, requiring clients to contribute sweat equity hours to earn their home, saying, "We give a hand-up, not a handout."

Under her leadership, Habitat's finances grew from \$20,000 to \$1.2 million in cash reserves and a \$1.2 million endowment, while also eliminating nearly \$500,000 in debt. The organization received state-level awards for four consecutive years.

Looking ahead, Johnson will expand her leadership training program, Leaders Edge, helping businesses and organizations refine their values and goals. She leaves Habitat with one simple philosophy: "Be nice to people."

Benton man arrested for September 2023 road rage incident



A Benton man, Michael Duncan, was arrested Friday in connection with a road rage incident that occurred in September 2023 near Mahan Gap Road in Ooltewah.

Authorities report that Duncan, driving a company vehicle, was tailgating another driver before the victim responded by brakechecking him. After the victim

partially exited his vehicle during the altercation, Duncan allegedly rammed the car once the driver was back inside. The vehicle belonged to the victim's mother, who was a passenger at the Morning Fax* time.

Further investigation revealed that Duncan's commercial license was expired at the time of the incident. He now faces charges of two counts of aggravated assault, driving on a suspended license, and vandalism.

Ordinance No. 1137 establishes a Morning Fax new city code, repeals certain outdat-Today's News. This Morning. ed ordinances, outlines penalties for violations, and sets procedures for future amendments.

Ordinance No. 1138 updates zoning and land use regulations by amending the stormwater management ordinance under the municipal code.
