Two identified in deadly Sweetwater house fire



Two people were killed in a house fire late Saturday night in Sweetwater, according to the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.

The family told <u>WVLT</u> that 86-year-old Marlene Sethney and 59-year-old Angela Cook were the ones who weren't able to escape the fire.

"I think everyone hasn't fully processed it just because it wasn't something we were expecting. If anything she was getting older and something was going to happen," said family member Cameron Krueger.

For Krueger, this means the loss of Sethney, a great aunt, and Cook, her aunt. Originally from Minnesota, Cook moved to Sweetwater several years ago along with her husband. As Sethney got older, she decided to spend the winter months with Cook in East Tennessee.

"I know that bringing in Marlene for the winters was huge for her just that she would be able to spend time with family that wasn't so close physically. Just to bring her down and get her in a warmer place to take care of her as she was getting older," said Krueger.

Krueger described both Sethney and Cook as family members who were extremely caring for one another, and would always go the extra mile to help someone. The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation is investigating the fire and Sheriff Tommy Jones said he does not believe there was foul play involved.

Fire Spreads from Backyard Burn in Etowah



A controlled burn quickly turned dangerous on Tuesday afternoon when flames from burning Bermuda grass spread from the backyard to the front yard of a residence on County Road 890.

The homeowner be-

lieved the fire was extinguished, but it reignited, setting front bushes ablaze and melting the vinyl soffit of the home's overhang.

Fire crews from Etowah Rural Fire, Etowah City Fire, and Englewood Rural Fire responded to the scene, with Etowah Rural Fire Chief Adam Hafley leading the effort.

Authorities remind residents to exercise caution with outdoor burns, ensuring fires are fully extinguished to prevent property damage.
