Tesla recalls over 46,000 Cybertrucks due to safety hazard



Tesla has issued a recall for 46,096 Cybertrucks due to a potentially dangerous flaw in the vehicle's exterior paneling. The recall, announced by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), affects all Cybertrucks manufactured between November 13, 2023, and February 27, 2025—essentially covering nearly every truck on the road.

According to the NHTSA report, the **cant rail assembly**, a stainless steel trim panel running along both sides of the windshield, is at risk of detaching while driving. Tesla ac-

knowledged that a loose panel could become a road hazard, increasing the risk of a crash. The issue stems from the adhesive used during assembly, which may be vulnerable to environmental factors.

To fix the problem, Tesla will reinforce and reattach the panel using a stronger adhesive. The company will provide free repairs to affected owners, with notification letters set to be mailed on May 19, 2025. Morning Fax

This marks the eighth recall for the Cybertruck since its release just over a year ago, adding to growing safety concerns about the highly anticipated electric vehicle.

Here are the latest updates:

The baseball program has won five of their last seven games. Included in those wins are a 16-13 win against Cumberland University, a 26-3 win against Kentucky Christian University, and a no

-hitter against Kentucky Christian. Anthony Figueroa threw the nohitter for the Bulldogs.

In the most recently released NAIA rankings, the three programs that were ranked, men's tennis (No. 2), baseball (No. 2), and women's tennis (No. 7) all maintained their spot in their respective sport's NAIA poll.
