

## Minor Earthquake detected near Tellico Plains



A small earthquake registering a magnitude of 2.0 was recorded in East Tennessee early Wednesday morning, April 30, according to preliminary data from the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS).

The quake occurred at 3:01 a.m. local time and was centered approximately 5.1 kilometers (3.2 miles) northeast of Tellico Plains. The epicenter was located at a depth of 20 kilometers beneath the Earth's surface.


Though minor, the tremor was also recorded near several nearby towns: roughly 19 miles east of Athens, 29 miles south-southwest of Maryville, and about 34 miles south of Farragut. The quake was approximately 114 miles north of Atlanta, Georgia. There have been no reports of damage or injuries associated with the earthquake. Given its low magnitude, it is unlikely that many residents felt the shaking.

The event was cataloged by the Southeast U.S. Seismic Network and the Center for Earthquake Research and Information at the University of Memphis.

#### Polk County Seniors Jumpstart Healthcare Careers with Phlebotomy Training

Seven graduating seniors from Polk County High School are getting a head start on their healthcare careers thanks to a partnership between Cleveland State Community College and Polk County Schools. Through an accelerated Phlebotomy Technician Bootcamp, the students are earning a nationally recognized certification before they even graduate.

The three-week program is held after school on the Cleveland State campus in the newly renovated Workforce CNA/Phlebotomy Lab. Led by nurse Vickie Sullivan, who brings 40 years of healthcare experience, the class teaches students how to safely perform venipunctures. At the end of the course, students will take the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Phlebotomy Technician Certification (CPT) exam.

"This helps get my foot in the door," said student Keila Navas, who plans to seek a summer job as a phlebotomist. All seven students intend to pursue healthcare careers and further their education in college this fall.

The program is funded by the Innovative School Model grant, now in its third year. The grant supports career-focused initiatives across Polk County, including an Innovation Center at Copper Basin High School, a Livestock Facility at Polk County High School, and a

Greenhouse at Chilhowee Middle School. It also funds career coaches to guide students in exploring advanced pathways.

"This grant allows our students to receive training in so many areas that will propel them to high-skill, high-wage careers," said Le-An Thomason, Work-Based Learning Coordinator and Career Coach at Polk County High School. "We appreciate Cleveland State's partnership and everything they do for our students." Students who continue at Cleveland State can earn college credit for the bootcamp, receiving a course substitution for Medical Terminology, an entry-level class in several healthcare programs.

"This is an amazing opportunity for students to train for a new career in healthcare and stack credentials for college credit," said Chelsea Falana, Workforce Specialist at Cleveland State. # Cleveland outlasts McMinn County in high-scoring Softball Showdown



Cleveland and McMinn County combined for seven home runs and 30 total hits Monday night, as the Lady Raiders held off a late rally to defeat the Lady Cherokees 15-10 in their District 5-4A regular season finale.

Cleveland built a commanding 14-3 lead behind home runs from Allison Farnsworth (2), Brylee Cisco, and Lilly Mason before McMinn County stormed back with a seven-run sixth inning, fueled by a pair of three-run blasts from Addie Miller and Madison Herd.

Despite the rally, Cleveland freshman pitcher Huntlee Dennison held on, recording the final outs and finishing with four strike-outs. Cisco led the offense with four hits and two RBIs, while Farnsworth went 3-for-3 with two homers and three RBIs.

Miller paced McMinn County with a perfect 3-for-3 night, including two home runs and six RBIs.

Both teams return to Athens Friday night to open the District 5 tournament. Cleveland (15-12, 5-1) will face Rhea County, while McMinn County (7-14, 1-5) takes on top-seeded Walker Valley.



#### Legislation Introduced to Study National Scenic Trail Status for Benton MacKaye Trail

A new bill introduced in Congress by Rep. Chuck Fleischmann seeks to evaluate the Benton MacKaye Trail for designation as a National Scenic Trail. The proposed legislation, known as the *Benton MacKaye National Scenic Trail Feasibility Study Act*, calls for a formal study of the 287-mile trail that winds through Georgia, Tennessee, and North Carolina.

The trail traverses diverse natural landscapes, including mountains, valleys, streams, and waterfalls. Approximately 95% of the trail lies on federally owned land and would be managed by the U.S. Forest Service if designated.

Supporters of the bill highlighted the trail's popularity and scenic value, noting its potential to boost tourism and promote outdoor recreation across the region. Lawmakers emphasized the importance of preserving and promoting access to the natural beauty found along the trail's route.

If passed, the bill would authorize the necessary study to evaluate the trail's eligibility and benefits as a designated National Scenic Trail.
