Inmates Earn HVAC Certification Through New Jail Program

Six inmates at the McMinn County Justice Center have earned HVAC certification through a new training program offered in partnership with Cleveland State Community College.

Funded by a \$1 million state grant, the jail now has an onsite lab for HVAC and welding. The recent bootcamp marked the first training session, with participants earning EPA Section 608 certification. Welding training will follow later this month. The program targets inmates already working outside jobs and aims to improve employment opportunities after release while reducing repeat offenses.


Motorists are advised to watch for new signage in this area and to use caution at this intersection. For more information, please contact the Office of the Public Works Department at 423-744-2745.



Two Cardiologists Join Starr Regional to Expand Heart Care Services

Starr Regional Medical Center has welcomed two experienced cardiologists, Dr. Maurice Alston and Dr. Selcuk Tombul, to its growing medical staff. Both physicians are now seeing patients at Starr Cardiology Associates in Athens, bringing advanced cardiovascular care closer to home for residents of McMinn County and surrounding areas.



Dr. Alston, an interventional cardiologist, offers minimally invasive procedures for treating coronary artery blockages, peripheral vascular disease, and venous thromboembolism. He also focuses on managing congestive heart failure and other conditions associated with cardiovascular disease. His training includes a cardiovascular fellowship at Ohio Health Medical System and an interventional cardiology fellowship at The Ohio State University. Dr. Alston is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology and serves on one of its national committees.



Dr. Tombul brings expertise in a broad range of cardiovascular conditions, including coronary artery disease, heart failure, hypertension, and circulatory disorders. He also performs diagnostic procedures such as echocardiograms, vascular ultrasounds, cardiac catheterizations, and pacemaker implants. He completed his cardiology fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University and continued training at the Medical College of Virginia Hospitals.

Starr Regional CEO John McLain said the addition of both doctors supports the hospital's commitment to expanding specialty care in the region. He described Alston and Tombul as "skilled clinicians" with a deep dedication to their patients and to improving heart health in the community. Basuini Steps Down as Head Coach of TWU Cross Country and Track Programs



Tennessee Wesleyan University's head cross country and track and field coach, Michael Basuini, is stepping down after eight years with the program to pursue opportunities outside of college athletics.

Basuini joined TWU in 2017 as an assistant coach and took over as interim head coach in 2021 before being officially named head coach in 2022. Under his leadership, the programs saw significant success, including 41 NAIA National Championship qualifiers and a national title in the women's triple jump in 2023. That same year, the women's outdoor track and field team finished second at the Appalachian Athletic Conference Championships. The cross country teams also sent five runners to nationals during his tenure.

Before becoming head coach, Basuini helped guide two

men and five women to the NAIA Cross Country Championships, coached a national champion 4x100m relay team, and mentored 35 All-Americans in track.

Basuini will assist with the transition as TWU begins the search for a new coach.

Vanderbilt QB Diego Pavia Declares Commodores Will "Run Tennessee" in 2025




Vanderbilt quarterback Diego Pavia is turning heads — and raising eyebrows in Knoxville — after confidently declaring the Commodores will take over college football in the state of Tennessee by the end of the 2025 season.

During a recent appearance on the *Bussin' With The Boys* Podcast, Pavia boldly claimed Vanderbilt will be the state's premier program: "Vanderbilt is gonna run Tennessee after this year," he said, adding that Nashville's appeal and Vanderbilt's strength in NIL deals will make the school a top destination for recruits. The 24-year-old quarterback is entering his sixth season of college football after a Tennessee judge granted him a preliminary injunction allowing an extra year of eligibility. His journey includes two seasons at New Mexico Military Institute, two at New Mexico State, and a transfer to Vanderbilt last year with head coach g Fax downs with only four interceptions, while rushing for 801 yards

and eight more scores. Despite his strong season, the Commodores fell to the Volunteers 36–23

last year in Nashville after leading early. To back up his bold prediction, Pavia and Vanderbilt will need to beat Tennessee head-to-head — a challenge set for November 29 in Knoxville. With his comments now making waves, expect plenty of buzz around that matchup. *Source: On3.com*
