Athens Police Investigating Fatal Crash Involving Motorcycle and Box Truck



The Athens City Police Department is investigating a fatal crash that occurred at the intersection of Redfern Drive and Congress Parkway North involving a motorcycle and a box truck.

Officers arrived on the scene and discovered two individuals involved, one of whom was pronounced dead at the scene. According to the department, evidence and witness statements revealed that two separate incidents occurred at the location.

After the initial collision, a dark-colored SUV reportedly struck the motorcyclist and fled northbound on Congress Parkway. Lieutenants Witt and Patterson are leading the investigation, which remains active. The names of those involved have not been released, though next of kin have been notified.

Police are asking anyone with information to contact the Athens Police Department. Nearby businesses are being asked to review surveillance footage, and detectives will be canvassing the area for additional leads. 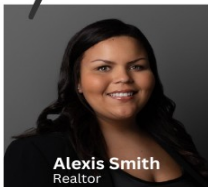

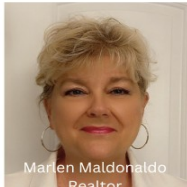
