Mobile Home Debris Fire Spreads in Calhoun, Prompting Multi-Agency Response



A controlled burn on County Road 750 got out of hand Monday afternoon, drawing a response from multiple fire departments and law enforcement agencies.

Around 1 p.m., the occupant of the property was burning debris from a dismantled mobile home when the fire spread beyond control. Crews from Claxton Fire Department, Calhoun Fire Department, and Etowah Rural Fire Department responded to the scene. Claxton firefighter Dexter Key served as incident commander, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department also assisted.

Fire officials quickly brought the fire under control, preventing further damage. They also issued a reminder to the public that burning construction materials or remnants—including mobile home debris—is illegal under EPA regulations.

Battle of Athens Festival returns to The Friendly City

The Battle of Athens Festival Committee is excited to announce the 5th annual Battle of Athens Festival! The event will take place on Saturday August 2, 2024 from 5:00 - 8:00 PM at Market Park in Athens.

The emphasis of this year's festival is the Downtown Walking Tour, which will be offered four times. The first two tours will be at 8:00 AM and 9:00 AM (Beat the Heat) and again at 7:00 PM and 8:00 PM (Sunset Tours). The tours will include photographs of the buildings and landmarks as they once appeared and the people involved in this amazing story. A new stop has been added to this year's tour!

The festival will feature displays with photos and information about the Battle, including the individuals involved, the issues of the campaign, and the back-story that led to the conflict. Memorabilia, artifacts, primary source materials, and resources that give multiple perspectives on the Battle will be included. Descendants of Battle participants will be among the guest speakers. Two large HD television screens will display a slideshow of photographs, various newspaper headlines, and more. A sound system will play audio interviews of Battle participants, as well as audio from the Battle itself, including the gunshots as broadcast live by local radio stations. Local historians will host a Q&A session.

Food trucks and historical/educational/cultural vendors will not be present at this year's festival, but plans are being made for their return next year, when we celebrate the 80th anniversary of the Battle. However, the organizers will still be selling festival t-shirts and have a door prize drawing. Also, bottled water will be available at a very cheap price!

The festival committee invites all individuals and families to join the celebration and learn more about the Battle of Athens. The committee hopes that everyone who attends the festival will develop a passion for local history as they commemorate the most important event in McMinn County's history.


