# Female Inmates Earn OSHA Certification Through Jail Education Program



McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy announced another step forward in rehabilitation and reentry efforts at the county jail, as several female inmates recently completed OSHA certification courses.

The OSHA 10-hour course, taught in partnership with Adult Education and the McMinn Education Foundation, equips inmates with essential workplace safety knowledge, including proper use of PPE, handling of chemicals, blood borne pathogen awareness, and accident prevention.

Inmates meet weekly with instructors over a 2- to 4-week period to complete class hours and testing. Upon successful completion, they receive an official OSHA certification card along with helpful resources such as interview tips, dress code guidance, resumé templates, and job application

links.

"This certification puts these women one step closer to employment upon release," Sheriff Guy said. "We are proud of their

hard work and hope this positive choice leads to even more success in their futures." Special thanks were given to Inmate Programs Coordinator Kayla Crowder for her dedication to making these opportunities possible.

#### Loudon County Native Drowns at Bald River Falls



The McMinn County Sheriff's Office has confirmed the death of a 37year-old man who drowned Saturday near Bald River Falls along River Road. The victim, originally from Loudon County and visiting from

Florida, was recovered following a coordinated response by first responders and the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Dive Team.

Authorities were on the scene for several hours conducting search and recovery operations. The area was temporarily closed to the public during the investigation. The victim's family has been notified. Officials ask the community to keep the family and friends of the man in their thoughts during this difficult time. # **AACA Announces Dynamic Start to 2025-26 Concert Season**


The Athens Area Council for the Arts (AACA) is opening its 2025–26 performance season with two exciting and diverse concerts that highlight the region's artistic talent and musical heritage.

First up, AACA presents *TWO*, a celebration of iconic duets, on **Friday**, **August 8 at 7:00 PM** in the Sue E. Trotter Black Box Theater. Directed by audience favorite G. David Brown—known for past productions like *Evening with the Stars*, '64–'71: *The Music of a Changing World*, and last year's *ONE—TWO* promises twice the harmony and heart. The concert will feature beloved duets from folk traditions to theatrical ballads, performed by a stellar lineup of local vocalists. They'll be backed by The Arts Center's house band, September Song, led by Music Director Andrew Kimball on guitar and vocals, and featuring Kyle Littleton (lead guitar), Joe Littleton (bass), Matt Flowers (drums), with special guests Ellen Kimball (keys) and Cody Hensley Sharp (brass). Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$15 for students.

Then, on Friday, September 12 at 7:00 PM, the Black Box Concert Series kicks off with Seth Mulder & Midnight Run, a band known for their high-energy fusion of traditional bluegrass, classic country, and folk. Formed in 2018 in the hills of East Tennessee, the band brings authenticity and flair to every performance, captivating both bluegrass purists and new fans alike. Tickets for the Black Box Concert Series range from \$20 to \$25, and early purchase is encouraged.

Both concerts take place in the **Sue E. Trotter Black Box Theater at The Arts Center**, located at 320 North White Street in Historic Downtown Athens. Supported by TWU and its partnership with Palacký University, the program continues to offer students immersive global learning opportunities.



#### Athens City Hall Hosts Japanese Exchange Students as Part of Sister Cities Program



On Thursday, July 24, Athens City Hall welcomed a delegation of 30 students and sponsors from *Chinzei Gakuin* in Isahaya, Japan, as part of the city's ongoing Sister Cities exchange program in partnership with Tennessee Wesleyan University and the Athens Sister Cities Committee.

The day began with a warm welcome from City Manager Dr. Randy Dowling, who spoke to the group about the structure of municipal, state, and national governments. His talk highlighted both the similarities and dif-

ferences between the systems in the U.S. and Japan, setting the tone for a day focused on learning and cultural exchange. Students were then treated to a behind-the-scenes tour of the Athens Fire and Police Departments. Highlights included hands-on demonstrations of fire engine tools and equipment, fingerprinting activities with local officers, and an up-close look at patrol cars and fire trucks. The visiting students showed great curiosity and enthusiasm throughout the visit.

"We are deeply grateful for the strong and enduring relationship we share with our Sister City, Isahaya," said Dr. Dowling. "It is through these exchanges that our communities grow closer, fostering understanding and lasting international friendships."
