McMinn County Man Arrested After Allegedly Firing at Sheriff's Deputy

A McMinn County man is behind bars after allegedly firing a handgun at a sheriff's deputy during a confrontation Monday evening.


According to Sheriff Joe Guy, the incident occurred around 8 p.m. on July 28 after Corporal Nathan Stiles was approached by a concerned citizen at the Dollar General in Riceville. The individual reported that **Stephen R. Goins**, 44, was acting erratically and firing a gun outside his home on Highway 11 South. When Corporal Stiles arrived at the residence, he spotted Goins standing near a maroon Chevrolet Tahoe in the driveway.

"Corporal Stiles identified himself multiple times as a deputy with the Sheriff's Office," said Sheriff Guy. "Despite that, Goins pointed a silver revolver at him and fired."

Stiles returned fire in self-defense and took cover as Goins retreated into the residence. A brief standoff followed, with additional deputies and Sgt. Caleb Latham arriving on scene. Goins was ultimately taken into custody without further incident.

He remains held at the McMinn County Justice Center and faces multiple charges, including Attempted First Degree Murder, Possession of a Firearm during the Commission of a Dangerous Felony, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, and Resisting Arrest. Sheriff Guy praised his officers' quick response and restraint.

"This is yet another example of the dangers our officers face every day," Guy said. "We're fortunate no one was hurt, but let this be clear: if you shoot at one of our deputies, we will shoot back." *Source: Press Release - McMinn Co. Sheriff Joe Guy*

Athens City Council to Hold Special Session Tomorrow

The Athens City Council will convene a special session on Thursday, July 31, at 5:30 p.m. in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers at the Athens Municipal Building.

The agenda includes a public hearing and possible action on a certificate of compliance for a proposed retail package store at 312 Congress Parkway South.

Council members will also consider updates to Article V (City Council) and Article XX (Department of Education) of the Athens City Charter. Proposed amendments to Title 13-III of the Athens City Code, which addresses dilapidated and unfit structures, will also be discussed.

As with all meetings, the session will begin with an invocation, pledge of allegiance, roll call, and an opportunity for public comments related to agenda items.

Early Morning Fire Damages Etowah Home



Firefighters responded to a structure fire early Monday morning on Washington Avenue in Etowah after flames broke out in an exterior kitchen area, spreading into the home.

The Etowah City Fire Department was dispatched around 1:30 a.m. and requested mutual aid. Crews arrived to find fire extending from the exterior wall into an interior bathroom. The homeowner reported seeing a glow through a window before safely evacuating the household. No injuries were reported.

Music City Loop Proposed for Nashville, Promises Innovation—But Raises Big Questions



Governor Bill Lee announced Monday that The Boring Company, founded by Elon Musk, plans to build the **Music City Loop** in Nashville—an underground, all-electric transportation system linking downtown to the airport in just eight minutes. The project, touted as a privately funded leap forward for infrastructure, will begin its public planning process immediately, with hopes to break ground in the near future and open the first segment by Fall 2026. Promoted as a **zero-emissions**, **congestion-reducing system**, the 10-mile loop will operate beneath state roads without costing taxpayers a dime. State and local officials, along with business leaders, praised the move as a visionary example of public-private partnership. **Source: TN Governor's Office**

However, while the proposal has drawn applause for its **innovation and funding model**, it also carries a number of **well-documented criticisms** based on The Boring Company's Vegas Loop project.

Capacity and Efficiency Concerns:

In cities like Las Vegas, where the company's Loop system is already running, critics argue the system functions more like a Tesla-powered novelty than true public transit. Unlike buses or trains, the system currently uses individual Tesla vehicles—often with human drivers—limiting capacity and raising questions about congestion and bottlenecks *inside* the tunnels themselves. *Source: Vice*

Despite the criticism, the Music City Loop continues to move forward, with strong political and industry support. Whether it becomes a **trailblazing model for urban mobility** or a high-profile misstep remains to be seen.
