Future of Tennessee Valley Fair at Chilhowee Park in Question



The Tennessee Valley Fair is raising concerns about its future at Chilhowee Park after the City of Knoxville announced plans to move Muse Knoxville into the Jacob Building.

The fair has used the Jacob Building for shopping areas and events for more than a century ENNESSEE at its East Knoxville location. Fair officials said they learned of the city's decision at the value of the ci

"We just want to know what our place is here," marketing director Abby Villas said. "It takes us 12–18 months to plan each fair, and we're already working on 2026, so it hurts us when we don't know exactly what's going on."

Knoxville Mayor Indya Kincannon said the fair will remain at Chilhowee Park through 2026 but will no longer have access to the Jacob Building once Muse Knoxville moves in. Other events that rely on the building, including Remote Area Medical's annual free health clinic, will also need new venues. Despite the uncertainty, Villas said the fair hopes to stay at Chilhowee Park. "It's our home," she said.

For now, the tradition continues. The Tennessee Valley Fair returns for its 105th year Sept. 5–14 at Chilhowee Park and Exposition

Center. This year's lineup includes concerts by **Jessie Murph**, **Styx**, and **Flo Rida**, along with rodeos, demolition derbies, the Anastasini Circus, livestock shows, and new attractions such as the Disc-Connected K9s Frisbee dog team and Cow Capers costume contest. Sweetwater Police Warn of Facebook Scam



The Sweetwater Police Department is alerting residents to a scam involving a fraudulent Facebook profile.

According to SPD, the profile is circulating false claims that permits have been issued allowing individuals to solicit money at the intersection of High-

ways 68 and 11. Officials clarified that no such permit has ever been issued—and none will ever be authorized—for that location. Police emphasized that anyone collecting money at the intersection is doing so illegally.

"We take these scams seriously and will continue to protect our community from fraudulent activity," the department stated.

SPD urged residents who encounter the fake profile or related posts to report them immediately.


