# Seven Indicted in Death of Monroe County Jail Inmate



Seven people have been criminally charged in connection with the February death of 74-year-old Lester Isbill while in the custody of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.

Tenth Judicial District Attorney General Stephen Hatchett announced the indictments Wednesday, shortly after the medical examiner amended Isbill's cause of death from natural causes to homicide, citing dehydration and restraint as contributing factors.

According to officials, Isbill was arrested for disorderly conduct on February 6 and placed in a restraint chair at the Monroe County Jail, where he later became unresponsive. His death was initially ruled natural, caused by heart arrhythmia due to underlying cardiovascular disease.

Following a second investigation and review of new evidence, including video from the jail, the case was reopened and the autopsy amended.

## Monroe Co. Indictment

Sheriff Tommy Jones released a <u>lengthy statement</u> on Wednesday, saying he has personally reviewed all available video and stands by his staff, though he acknowledged that some policy violations had occurred and were addressed internally.

Jones questioned why the autopsy was amended, claiming the pathologist admitted to viewing only clips of the incident, most of which were submitted by the media or family, not the full 9.5 hours of video.

"Did I or do I believe that anyone from my staff is guilty of homicide? The answer is unequivocally no," Jones said. "While I will not speculate on the motives behind the most recent investigation or the timing of these indictments, I remain concerned that the process has been influenced by selective information and external pressures."

District Attorney Hatchett emphasized that the case will proceed according to the law and be decided "in a court of law, not the court of public opinion."

All individuals are presumed innocent until proven guilty.

## Vols Stick With Tradition as They Host ETSU in Home Opener



Tennessee football is keeping things classic for its Week 2 home opener. The No. 17 Vols (1-0) will take the field in white helmets, orange jerseys, and white pants when they host in-state rival East Tennessee State (1-0) this Saturday at 3:30 p.m. ET at Neyland Stadium. The game will air on ESPN+ and SEC Network+. Audio will stream online on the Tennessee Athletics app (Download for <u>Apple or Android</u>), or <u>UTSports.com</u>. English Commentary will be provided by the "Voice of the Vols" Mike Keith with Spanish Commentary provided by the "¡Vamos Vols!" team of <u>Carlos Lopez (play-by-play) and J.P. Vasquez (Color Analysis)</u>.

Tennessee opened the 2025 season with a 45-26 victory over Syracuse in Atlanta on Aug. 30, wearing their standard home uniform. This Saturday's game will mark the second consecutive contest in which the Vols sport their signature home combination, a tradition fans have come to embrace before Tennessee switches to Adidas uniforms in 2026.

East Tennessee State enters the matchup with momentum of its own after a 45-17 win against Murray State in Week 1. However, history favors the Vols, who beat the Buccaneers 59-3 in their only previous meeting on Sept. 8, 2018, at Neyland Stadium. Expecta-

tions are high for Tennessee this weekend. Predictions have the Vols winning comfortably, with scores ranging from 52-10 to 59-7. ESPN's Football Power Index gives Tennessee a 99% chance to come out on top, with quarterback Joey Aguilar anticipated to have a standout passing performance against the Buccaneers' defense. With a dominant Week 1 behind them and home-field advantage in Knoxville, the Vols are poised to continue their strong start to the 2025 season. Fans can expect a traditional Tennessee performance—fast-paced, high-scoring, and full of energy at Neyland Stadium this Saturday.
