### **Monroe County 911 Services Restored After Battery Malfunction**



Monroe County's 911 Center has fully restored operations after a technical malfunction forced emergency calls to be rerouted Tuesday around 11:30 a.m.

According to 911 Director April White, the center experienced issues when a pair of large backup batteries began overheating, releasing a toxic odor that triggered carbon monoxide alarms inside the building. Madisonville Fire Department responded, and it was determined the batteries posed a potential explosion risk. For safety, dispatchers evacuated and shifted into a contingency plan. Emergency calls were immediately re-

routed to McMinn and Loudon counties, with dispatchers working outside on portable radios and personal phones while staying in constant communication with neighboring 911 centers. "All emergency communications are set up to instantly be rerouted if needed," White said. "At no point were citizens without 911 service."

Multiple agencies responded, including Athens City Fire, Englewood Fire, Tri-Community Fire, Monroe County EMS, and the Highway Department. EMS personnel assessed dispatchers for exposure, while specialized crews removed the defective batteries. White praised the quick actions of Madisonville Fire Chief Todd Torbett, who led incident command, along with assistance from Sweetwater Fire Chief John Anderson and the county's IT staff.

"This isolated incident was caused by defective batteries and could not have been foreseen," White said. "We are grateful for the support of McMinn and Loudon counties and thankful to the community for helping us share updates." All emergency and non-emergency lines are now fully operational.





## Vols Aim to Topple Georgia in Checker Neyland Showdown

Neyland Stadium will be rocking on Saturday as No. 15 Tennessee hosts No. 3 Georgia in a game that could tilt the balance of the SEC race. With 101,915 fans expected to "checker" the stadium in orange and white, the Volunteers are leaning on home-field advantage to finally get past a Bulldogs team that has dominated the series in recent years.

Tennessee enters the matchup at 2–0, fueled by an offense that has been both explosive and balanced. Quarterback Joey Aguilar has quickly gained command, throwing for 535 yards and five touchdowns without an interception while also connecting on deep strikes to Braylen Staley and Mike Matthews. Add in a ground game averaging more than 250 yards per contest, and the Vols look capable of testing Georgia's vaunted defense like few teams have.

Georgia, also 2–0, has looked less convincing. Quarterback Gunner Stockton has shown poise in his first two starts, but the Bulldogs' passing attack has lacked consistency. Against Austin Peay last week, Georgia managed just 34 points in a performance that raised questions about offensive firepower. While the Bulldogs' defense, led by Cristen Miller and CJ Allen, has given up just one touchdown all season, they now face a Tennessee offense brimming with confidence and urgency.

The atmosphere in Knoxville could be the deciding factor. With the stadium split into checkerboard sections of orange and white, the Vols will count on noise and energy to rattle a Georgia team making its first road trip of the season.

Tennessee's biggest challenge remains its thin secondary, missing top cornerbacks Jermod McCoy and Rickey Gibson. But the Vols believe their offense can outscore Georgia if Aguilar continues his efficient play and the run game establishes rhythm early. Georgia hasn't allowed more than 17 points to a Josh Heupel-coached Tennessee squad, but this may be the game when that statistic is broken. Neyland has proven to be one of the toughest venues in college football, and with the crowd behind them, the Vols could make a defining statement.

Prediction: Tennessee 34, Georgia 27.
