

Dale Earnhardt Jr. to Headline Athens Chamber Benefit in 2026



The Athens Chamber of Commerce has announced that NASCAR legend Dale Earnhardt Jr. will be the featured speaker at its 19th Annual Benefit on July 16, 2026. The event will take place at McMinn County High School, with doors opening at 6 p.m. Tickets went on sale Tuesday morning and are available online at http://www.itickets.com/events/483928.html, by calling 423-745-0334, or at the Chamber office in downtown Athens.

Earnhardt Jr., a third-generation racer, is one of NASCAR's most celebrated figures. Over his career, he captured 26 NASCAR Cup victories, including two Daytona 500 titles (2004, 2014), and earned a record 15 consecutive Most Popular Driver awards. His success on and off the track led to his 2021 induction into the NASCAR Hall of Fame.

Beyond racing, Earnhardt Jr. has become a successful businessman, author, and broadcaster. His ventures include JR Motorsports, which has won three NASCAR Xfinity Series championships, and Hammerhead Entertainment, a television production company. He also co-owns FilterTime and the CARS Tour, and is the voice behind the popular podcast network Dirty Mo Radio.

In addition to his career achievements, Earnhardt Jr. is known for his charitable work through The Dale Jr. Foundation, which supports youth and underprivileged communities.

The Chamber's annual benefit is one of the largest events of the year, and organizers expect strong demand for tickets with Earnhardt Jr. as the keynote speaker.

Driver Injured After Vehicle Overturnson Highway 163



Emergency crews from Claxton Fire Department, Calhoun Fire Department, and Etowah Rescue and Rural Fire Department responded to a motor vehicle accident on Highway 163 near County Road 967 around 8 p.m. Monday, Sept. 15.

According to officials, the driver reported swerving to avoid a deer that entered the roadway. The vehicle, traveling east-bound, crossed into the westbound lane before overturning and coming to rest on its top along the embankment.

The driver sustained minor injuries and was transported by AMR for treatment. Calhoun Fire Department Assistant Chief Justin Evans served as incident commander at the scene.


