### Athens City Council to hold Special Called Session Thursday



The City of Athens will hold a **Special Called Session** of the **Athens City Council** at **6:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 23, 2025**, at **Athens City Hall**, 815 North Jackson Street. According to a notice signed by **Mayor Larry Eaton**, the meeting will include several key items involving council policy, citizen participation, and personnel matters.

The council will discuss and take action to restore a Code of Conduct for Council Members, revise the Citizen Comment Rules governing how citizens speak at public meetings, and establish a policy and procedures for handling complaints made against city staff, em-

ployees, and council members. Members will also consider **engaging in mediation** with **Glenn Whiting** to resolve all past and current disputes, including issues surrounding the removal of writing on the Downtown Walls Forever building and allowing a mural to be painted over it.

In addition, the agenda includes a **reading of a letter** recognizing **Councilmember Dr. Dick Pelley** for his "Years on the Council," followed by official **acceptance of his retirement**, which becomes effective at the adjournment of the meeting. The council will also consider action to **approve one year of salary minus taxes**, to be paid to Dr. Pelley in a **lump sum in November 2025**, totaling \$3,504.52. Another item calls for **authorization for the City Attorney** to prepare and file documents to **dismiss the ouster suit** involving Dr. Pelley upon his retirement.

Citizens attending the meeting will be allowed **five minutes to speak** on each agenda item as it is addressed. For additional information, residents may contact the **Office of the City Manager** at (423) 744-2702.

#### Rare Railroad Documents Donated to Etowah Depot Museum

The Etowah Depot Museum has received two historic additions thanks to a donation from Jason Knox. The rare documents inthe original clude 1899 charter for the International Grand Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, Hiwassee Division No. 547, originally based in Blue Ridge,



Georgia, whose members later transferred to Etowah around 1906.

The second item is the original 1945 charter for the Firemen and Trainmen Grand Lodge No. 960, representing another key piece of the region's rich railroad heritage.

## Combine Destroyed in Field Fire Near Englewood



A 1994 John Deere 9500 combine was heavily damaged by fire Saturday evening after the operator reported a fuel tank issue that ignited flames around the tank area. The incident occurred around 5 p.m. in a field just outside the Englewood city limits on Highway 39 East.

The blaze caused significant damage to both the combine and a grain table located nearby. ## Starr Regional Performs First Leadless Pacemaker Implant



Starr Regional Medical Center has completed its first implantation of the Micra<sup>TM</sup> leadless pacemaker, marking a major advancement in local cardiac care. The procedure was performed by Dr. Yasir Akhtar and the hospital's cardiac catheterization team, offering patients with bradycardia (slow heart rate) a safer, less invasive treatment option.

Unlike traditional pacemakers, the Micra device is implanted directly into the heart through a catheter, eliminating the need for leads and allowing for quicker recovery and fewer complications.

The milestone highlights Starr Regional's continued investment in advanced heart care. Since opening its cardiac catheterization lab in 2023, the hospital has provided diagnostic, interventional, and rehabilitative cardiovascular services, serving as the only facility within a 30-mile radius to offer such specialized care.

## Vols Fall to Alabama, Turn Focus to Rivalry Clash at Kentucky

The 11th-ranked Tennessee Volunteers saw their College Football Playoff hopes take a major hit Saturday night, falling 37–20 to No. 6 Alabama at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Costly penalties, missed tackles, and a 99-yard interception return before halftime proved too much to overcome as the Vols dropped to 5–2 (2–2 SEC).

After falling behind early, quarterback Joey Aguilar led a 10-play, 78-yard scoring drive capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass to Braylon Staley to even the score at 7–7. Alabama quickly regained control with a safety, a short touchdown run, and the backbreaking interception return by Zabien Brown as time expired in the first half, sending Tennessee into the locker room trailing 23–7.

Running back DeSean Bishop provided a spark early in the third quarter with a 44-yard touchdown run to trim the deficit to 23–13, but Alabama responded with a 99-yard drive capped by an 11-yard touchdown pass from Ty Simpson to Rico Scott. Bishop added another short touchdown late, though the Tide's Daniel Hill answered with a 4-yard run to put the game away.

Aguilar completed 28 of 44 passes for 268 yards and a touchdown, extending his FBS-leading streak to 31 consecutive games with at least 200 passing yards. Staley hauled in 10 catches for 92 yards, while Bishop rushed for 123 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Edrees Farooq led the defense with seven tackles, and Tennessee's front managed four tackles for loss, but defensive lapses at key moments hurt their chances.

With the loss, Tennessee's playoff hopes are fading fast. To stay in the mix, the Vols will likely need to win out — a tough task with road trips ahead, including a late-November visit to Florida, where Tennessee hasn't won since 2003. Still, head coach Josh Heupel urged his team to move forward.

"You have to flip it forward," Heupel said. "Whether you win or lose, you watch the video, learn from it, and get ready for the next one."

That next one comes Saturday night as the Vols head to Lexington to face Kentucky at Kroger Field (7:45 p.m. ET, SEC Network). Heupel is 4–0 against the Wildcats and owns a 12–2 record following a loss during his tenure. A win would not only extend that streak but also secure bowl eligibility for a fifth straight season — something Tennessee hasn't done since 2000–2004. **Source:** atozsports.com//UTSports.com
