Athens Man Charged in Ongoing Child Exploitation Investigation



Special agents with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force have arrested an Athens man following an investigation into child exploitation.

TBI agents began investigating after receiving a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children about child sexual abuse material (CSAM) uploaded by a Discord user later identified as Micah Boring, 25. With assistance from the Athens Police Department, agents executed a search warrant at Boring's residence, seizing multiple electronic devices. A forensic review of those devices revealed thousands of images of CSAM, according to the TBI.

On September 16, the McMinn County Grand Jury returned indictments charging Boring with one count of sexual exploitation of a minor (over 100 images) and one count of aggravated sexual exploitation of a minor (over 25 images). He was arrested on September 30 and booked into the McMinn County Jail on a \$500,000 bond.

Authorities emphasize that all charges are allegations, and Boring is presumed innocent until proven guilty in court.

Driver Hospitalized Following Crash on County Road 603



Emergency crews responded to a single-vehicle crash Sunday afternoon on County Road 603 near Athens after a 2013 Nissan Armada left the roadway and struck a tree down an embankment. The crash occurred around 3:30

p.m., and the driver had to be extricated after the impact left the door blocked by the tree.

The driver was treated at the scene and transported by AMR to Tennova Turkey Creek Medical Center for further care. Etowah Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, Claxton Fire, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department responded to the scene, with Etowah Rural Assistant Fire Chief Kevin Elliott in command. Tennessee Highway Patrol Sgt. Kyle Millsaps is investigating the accident.

- The Athens Utilities Board (AUB) advises customers that natural gas rates will rise beginning in December due to a 120% increase from its pipeline supplier, East Tennessee Natural Gas (ETNG). The change, approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, takes effect November 1, 2025, and will add about \$0.146 per therm to transportation costs roughly \$60 more per year for the average household. AUB notes it has no control over the increase, as ETNG is the only pipeline serving East Tennessee. Customers can find energy-saving tips at www.aub.org.


