Seven Charged in Death of Monroe County Inmate

Seven people connected to the Monroe County Jail — including five former and current sheriff's office employees and two nurses — were arraigned Monday in connection with the in-custody death of 74-year-old Lester Isbill.

The group faces a range of charges, including official misconduct, criminally negligent homicide, and filing false reports, according to court documents.

Isbill died on February 7, one day after being arrested for disorderly conduct. Monroe County Sheriff Tommy Jones previously stated that Isbill was placed in a restraint chair and fitted with a mesh spit mask during his detention.

His death was initially ruled accidental due to health complications, but the Knox County Regional Forensic Center later determined the cause of death to be homicide, citing factors including dehydration and prolonged restraint.

Isbill's daughter, Windy Duncan, said her father went nine hours without medication or basic care before his death.

Records show prior disciplinary actions for several of the defendants. Sergeant Josh Duncan was suspended after allowing falsified logs related to Isbill's restraint. Officer Tyler Finger, another defendant, was previously terminated from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office over a sexual assault allegation that did not lead to criminal charges.

Those charged include former sheriff's office employees Joshua Duncan, Tommy Reagan, Tyler Finger, Elijah Spencer, and Jerron Henry, who face official misconduct charges. Nurses Courtney Woods and Greg Mills are charged with criminally negligent homicide and filing a false report. A status hearing in the case is scheduled for February 27, 2026.

In a statement shared with staff and families, school officials described Dr. Goodin as a "talented and driven leader who cared deeply about students, staff, and families." Her leadership and vision, the district said, made a lasting impact on the school system and community.


To allow time for grieving, all McMinn County schools and the district office will be closed on Friday, October 24, designated as an optional professional development day for staff to gather and receive grief counseling. TDEC Announces \$968,000 in Parks and Recreation Planning Grants

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) announced \$968,000 in grants from the Local Parks and Recreation Fund (LPRF) for parks and recreation planning for 18 communities across the state including \$48,000 to both the Cities of Etowah and Dayton.

The Planning Grant Program provides state funding to match local government investments for communities who want to create or update a Parks and Recreation Systemwide Plan. This is an 80 percent state and 20 percent community matching grant.

"We appreciate all the communities who have gone through the process to receive these grants," said Greer Tidwell, deputy director of Conservation for TDEC. "The investments will improve quality of life throughout our state. We look forward to seeing the plans that come from this assistance."

"Outdoor spaces are at the heart of Tennessee communities," said Brian Clifford, director of the Office of Outdoor Recreation. "With these grants, we're helping local leaders plan for parks that inspire healthier lives, stronger economies, and lasting connections to our state's natural beauty."

Multiple-Vehicle Crash on Highway 11 Leaves One Injured



A chain-reaction crash involving four vehicles occurred Wednesday night around 10 p.m. on Highway 11 near County Road 326 in McMinn County.



According to reports, a Dodge Dakota traveling south on Highway 11 collided with a Dodge Ram that pulled out onto the highway, sending the Ram into a nearby ditch. Both drivers were the sole occupants of their vehicles and reported no injuries to dis-



Moments later, a Nissan Sentra traveling south came upon the stopped Dakota in the roadway. The driver swerved to avoid it but struck a Dodge Caravan heading north. The driver of the Nissan was transported to a local

hospital for treatment, while the passenger declined medical attention. Chad Gates with the Niota Rural Fire Department led operations at the scene. Responding agencies included AMR, Niota Fire, North McMinn, and Athens Rural Fire Departments. Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper D.J. Taylor is leading the investigation.
