Two Dead in Shooting at Barku Plastics in Cleveland; Suspect Found Dead After Standoff



A deadly shooting Monday morning at Barku Plastics left two employees dead, including the company's vice president, according to Cleveland Police. Authorities identified the victims as Ivan Aldergot, the Vice President of Barku Plastics, and Tobias Gleinig, another employee whose role with the company has not yet been confirmed.

Police say the shooting occurred shortly after 10 a.m. at the Barku Plastics facility, located off Old Chattanooga Pike in southwest Cleveland. Responding officers found both men dead inside the plant, and investigators are treating the incident as a double homicide. According to police, the suspect — believed to be a former employee — fled the scene in a vehicle that was later located at a residence on Westview Lane in Bradley County.

A tense standoff followed as officers surrounded the home. Cleveland Police say tactical units deployed a robot and drone to gain entry after several hours, and once inside, officers discovered the body of a man who appeared to have died from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. Authorities are awaiting official confirmation from the Medical Examiner's Office to determine the suspect's identity. Neighbors described the ordeal as shocking and heart-breaking. "It's been an emotional day — this is a quiet street," said Joshua Scott, who lives nearby. "It's something our community will never forget." Both victims were reportedly German citizens working in supervisory roles at the plant.

Barku Plastics, founded in Cleveland in 2003, is a custom plastic injection molding and profile extrusion company operating as a subsidiary of Barku Kunststofftechnik GmbH, a German manufacturer established in 1977. The company supplies plastic components for industries including automotive, agriculture, and consumer goods. Police continue to investigate the motive behind the shooting.

Athens Area Council for the Arts Presents Dual Exhibits Featuring National Geographic Photographer and Textile Artist




