Vehicle Fire Destroys Van, Damages Home in Etowah Thursday Night

A Thursday evening fire destroyed a van and damaged a home on County Road 498 after the vehicle burst into flames under a carport.

According to reports, the homeowner arrived around 7 p.m. and parked her 2006 Honda Odyssey beneath the carport. She noticed an unusual odor coming from the vehicle but could not identify it and went inside the house. Moments later, she and her husband saw a bright glow outside their window — the van's engine was on fire.

Fire crews arrived to find the vehicle fully engulfed in flames. The blaze caused extensive damage to the carport and vinyl siding before it was extinguished. The Honda Odyssey was declared a total loss.

Responding agencies included Etowah City Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, and Englewood Rural Fire, with Englewood Rural Fire Chief Billy Roach commanding the scene. Medal of Honor Recipient to Speak at Cleveland State in February 2026



Cleveland State Community College Foundation will host Medal of Honor recipient Jim "Doc" McCloughan on Thursday, Feb. 19, 2026, at the Partners in Industry and Education (PIE) Center. The event, presented by Builtwell Banking, will feature a reception, dinner, and interview, with proceeds supporting student

scholarships through the Cleveland State Foundation.


McCloughan, a Vietnam War combat medic drafted into the U.S. Army in 1968, earned numerous honors including two Purple Hearts, two Bronze Stars, and the Congressional Medal of Honor—the nation's highest military award.

Following his service, McCloughan spent 38 years teaching and coaching at South Haven High School in Michigan. He has since remained active in veteran and community service, including leadership roles with the Congressional Medal of Honor Society.

While in Cleveland, McCloughan will also speak to local middle and high school students on Feb. 20. Tickets for the Feb. 19 event are \$100 and available at mycs.cc/eveningwith. A limited number of tickets for veterans are available through a special donation.



Pancreatic cancer has a 99% mortality rate, the highest rate of any cancer. The average life expectancy after diagnosis is just 3-5 months. Despite the lethal nature of this disease, only 1% of the National Cancer Institute's current budget is focused on pancreatic research.

Etowah native Ronnie Raper, Jr. knows about pancreatic cancer in a very personal way – his father-in-law Doyle Williams passed away in 1995 and the illness claimed his father Ronnie "Cotton" Raper in 2006. Raper made a proactive choice in 2007 to form CottonFest – a nonprofit pancreatic fundraiser and for the last 20 years he along with the CottonFest board of directors have been actively raising money for research treatment and education and have served as a reference source for pancreatic cancer patients and their families.
