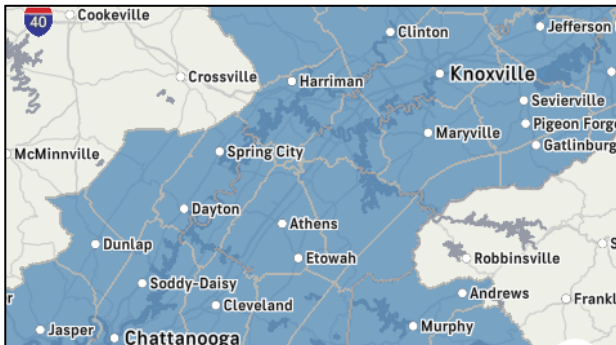

Weather Update: Winter Storm Watch Issued for McMinn County, East Tennessee



A Winter Storm Watch has been issued for McMinn County and much of East Tennessee, remaining in effect from late Friday night through Sunday evening, as forecasters warn of the potential for heavy snow and significant ice accumulation across the region.

According to the National Weather Service, the storm system could bring a mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain. Snow accumulations of 4 to 10 inches are possible, especially north of Knoxville, with the heaviest snowfall expected near the Kentucky border and far western Virginia. Areas south of Knoxville, including parts of East Tennessee, could see ice accumulations of up to one-half inch, with the greatest icing likely south of a line from Crossville to Tellico Plains, including portions of the southern Cumberland Plateau.

The combination of snow and ice could lead to widespread power outages, downed trees, and extremely hazardous travel conditions. Officials warn that travel may become impossible at times during the storm. Forecasters note that the storm presents a complicated and evolving forecast, with uncertainty remaining about the exact placement of the heaviest snow and ice. Residents are urged to closely monitor updated forecasts in the coming days, as significant changes are still possible.

Light snow mixed with rain may develop over higher elevations late tonight into Thursday morning, though little to no accumulation is expected during that period. More impactful winter weather is anticipated as the main system moves into the area over the weekend, followed by colder temperatures that could cause snow and ice to linger into next week.

Residents across McMinn County and surrounding areas are encouraged to stay weather-aware, prepare for potential power outages, and limit travel during periods of severe winter weather.

Gov. Bill Lee to Deliver Final State of the State Address Feb. 2

Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee announced Wednesday, Jan. 21, that he will deliver his final State of the State address to the General Assembly and Tennesseans on Monday, Feb. 2, at 6 p.m. CST.

The address will be presented during a joint session of the Tennessee General Assembly in the House Chamber at the Tennessee State Capitol. The speech will mark the governor's final State of the State as he enters his last year in office.

"Since the earliest days of our country, Tennesseans have always been people who press on to the next frontier to lead America," said Gov. Lee. "As we begin our final year together, I'm grateful for what we've accomplished and confident that the decisions we make today will help define Tennessee's next chapter and our role in America's future."

The address will be broadcast statewide and streamed live on Gov. Lee's Facebook and YouTube channels, allowing residents across Tennessee to watch the speech in real time.

Cleveland Police Lieutenant Bobby Ruth Marks 18 Years of Service

After completing the Law Enforcement Training Academy at Cleveland State, Ruth was hired by the department and served five years as a patrol officer. His career has included five years as a School Resource Officer at E.L. Ross Elementary School, supervisory roles, and work in criminal investigations beginning in 2020. He later returned to Cleveland State to earn an associate degree in criminal justice and government service and was promoted to lieutenant in September 2025.

Severe Weather Postpones Weekend Performances of "Now We Juke-ing!"

Athens Community Theatre and the Athens Area Council for the Arts have announced that two performances of *Now We Juke-ing! The Thursday, January 22, and Friday, January 23, performances will proceed as scheduled, while the Saturday, January 24, performance has been moved to Saturday, January 31, and the Sunday, January 25, performance has been rescheduled for Sunday, February 1.
