### Two Dead in Rhea County **Shooting Incident**

The Rhea County Sheriff's Office responded to a welfare check Tuesday morning at a residence on Lauren Lane, uncovering a tragic scene involving two gunshot victims.

Deputies were dispatched at approximately 11:48 a.m. Upon arrival, they found a deceased woman with an apparent gunshot wound inside the home and a man critically injured by a gunshot.

Emergency medical personnel transported the man to a designated air medical location, but he succumbed to his injuries upon arrival at the helipad.

Authorities are actively investigating the circumstances surrounding the incident. The Rhea County Sheriff's Office has assured the public there is no immediate threat to the community.

#### **Emergency Responders Conduct Search** at Frozen Pond in Athens

Emergency responders from the Athens Fire and Police Departments were called to Prof Powers Park on Slack Road after Officer Queen noticed a scooter and articles of clothing near a frozen pond, raising concerns that someone may have fallen through the ice.

Upon inspection, responders found an open hole in the ice, prompting a multi-agency search effort. Chief Brandon Ainsworth and Lieutenant Patterson coordinated assistance from neighboring agencies, including the McMinn County Rescue Squad, Monroe County Dive Team, and Hamilton County Sheriff's Drone and Dive Team. Englewood Fire Department's Medic 3 provided support for divers during the search.

Using divers, underwater cameras, sonar, and drones, the teams conducted an extensive search but found no evidence of a body.


#### Gas Prices Rise Amid Higher Oil Costs Despite Low Demand

The national average for a gallon of gas has increased by four cents over the past week to \$3.10, largely driven by rising oil prices, which are hovering around \$80 per barrel. According to AAA spokesperson Andrew Gross, "Domestic gasoline demand is low, so why are pump prices creeping higher? Look at the cost of oil." He noted that global oil prices have surged due to strong demand for winter heating fuels and new U.S. sanctions against Russia's energy sector. Oil costs account for 56% of gas prices, leading to the recent increase.

Despite the rise, 26 states still report averages below \$3 per gallon. The Energy Information Administration (EIA) reports that gasoline demand dropped last week to 8.32 million barrels per day, while domestic gasoline stocks increased to 243.6 million barrels.

Today's gas price average is eight cents higher than a month ago and three cents higher than a year ago. Meanwhile, the cost per kilowatt hour of electricity at public EV charging stations remains steady at 34 cents.

In women's basketball, Bryan College secured a 60-50 victory over Tennessee Wesleyan University, with Jacelyn Stone leading all scorers with 20 points.


In men's action, TWU triumphed over Bryan College 85 -71. Amauri Young, who led six players in double figures, scored 20 points.
