Starr Regional Nurse Chris Brackett Receives DAISY Award

Starr Regional Medical Center has announced that **Chris Brackett**, **RN**, is the recipient of the **DAISY Award for Extraordinary Nurses** for the second quarter of 2025. The DAISY Award is an international recognition program that honors nurses for their skill, compassion, and dedication to patients and families. Brackett, who serves on the hospital's Medical-Surgical Unit, was praised for his clinical excellence as well as the kindness and comfort he provides to every patient.

"It is always a privilege to present the DAISY Award to one of our outstanding nurses," said **Deborah Vaughn, RN, MSN, Chief Nursing Officer** at Starr Regional. "Chris chose nursing because he truly cares about people, and that passion shines through in everything he does."

A nomination submitted on Brackett's behalf highlighted the impact of his care, noting how he made a patient and family feel at ease during a difficult hospital stay. The nominator wrote, "He quickly addressed all needs, including pain, without making us feel like we bothered him. He is by far the best nurse I have ever dealt with."

The DAISY Award presentation took place as a surprise ceremony, surrounded by Brackett's colleagues, patients, and visitors. Each honoree receives a certificate of recognition and a hand-carved sculpture titled "A Healer's Touch" created by artists of the Shona Tribe in Africa. The DAISY Foundation was established in 1999 by the family of **J. Pat**-

rick Barnes, who died at age 33 from complications of an auto-immune disease. His family created the award to honor the extraordinary care nurses provide to patients and their loved ones.

Madisonville Man Arrested for Sexual Exploitation of a Minor

The Madisonville Police Department Criminal Investigations Division has arrested Jamie Adam Hughes, 32, on charges related to the sexual exploitation of a minor. The investigation began after a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children led CID Sergeant Trey Kilby and detectives to execute a search warrant at Hughes' residence.

Hughes was found in possession of multiple sexually explicit images of minors and was indicted by the Monroe County Grand Jury on February 12, 2025, for one count of Sexual Exploitation of a Minor involving more than 100 images. He was booked into the Monroe County Jail with bond set at \$100,000.

The defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.


Three Arrested in Cleveland-Area Human Trafficking Operation

Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) agents arrested three men in Hamilton County during an undercover human trafficking operation focused on the Cleveland area. The effort aimed to rescue victims of trafficking and apprehend those attempting to engage in sexual acts with minors.

The following individuals were arrested on August 19:

- James Bedford, 52, Clearwater, Fla. one count of Patronizing Prostitution (no bond).
- **Pedro Garcia**, 26, Cleveland, Tenn. one count of Patronizing Prostitution (no bond).
- Muhammad Ozair Khan, 29, Chattanooga, Tenn. one count of Patronizing Prostitution (bond: \$2,500).

The operation was a joint effort involving the TBI Human Trafficking Unit, Tennessee Human Trafficking Task Force, FBI, Collegedale Police, Cleveland Police, Bradley County Sheriff's Office, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, and the 10th and 11th Judicial District Attorneys' Offices. Vols Gear Up for Season Opener as Heupel Gets Contract Extension




With only one day until the season opener, the No. 24/18 Tennessee Volunteers took Haslam Field Tuesday morning to continue preparations for Saturday's Aflac Kickoff Game against Syracuse at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta (12 p.m. ET, ABC).

Defensive Coordinator Tim Banks and Running Backs Coach De'Rail Sims spoke to the media following practice. Banks discussed the challenges of facing an opponent with new starters, noting, "The first game is always different... It's always a chess match, but at the end of the day, we lean on our training and execution." Sims emphasized patience and consistency for his running backs: "We have to get those dirty yards early on, and then the big plays will come. If you allow that to work itself out, good things will happen."

Adding to the excitement around Rocky Top, Head Coach Josh Heupel has received a contract extension through January 2030, following his leadership during Tennessee football's winningest three-year stretch in more than two decades. Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Danny White said, "Josh has brought Tennessee Football back to its rightful place among the nation's elite programs, and he and his staff have fostered a positive culture within the team."

Heupel has guided the Volunteers to a 37-15 record, 11 wins over Top 25 teams, multiple double-digit win seasons, and the program's first College Football Playoff and New Year's Six appearances. "We took over a program in 2021 during a turbulent time... I am excited about the future of Tennessee Football," Heupel said.

Under Heupel, Tennessee has also excelled off the field. The team set consecutive GPA records, produced 60 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients in the fall of 2024, and developed a program that emphasizes personal growth, leadership, and community engagement through the eVOLve initiative. The Vols will open the season against Syracuse on Saturday at noon ET, with Heupel entering his fifth season at the helm. *Source: UTSports.com*

Today In History

1930 - W.A. Spooner was born in England. He created such inverted expressions as "Which of you hissed the mystery class?" Such mixed-up expressions came to be known as "Spoonerisms." Comedian Archie Campbell did several routines using Spoonerisms, including "Beeping Sleauty" and "Rindacella."

1944 - American troops marched down the Champs Elysees in Paris as the French capital continued to celebrate its liberation from the
